

Plano ISD Sports
2007-08 Year in Review

The Fall brought:

- Plano West Team Tennis District Championship and they advanced to the Regional Final (Coach Morgen Walker was named 5A Coach of the year by the Texas Tennis Coaches Association and the National Federation.
- Plano Sr. Team Tennis finished 2nd in District and advanced to the Regional Tournament
- Plano West Cross Country- Both girls and boys were District Champions and advanced to regionals
- Plano Sr. Cross Country had the boys finish 2nd in District with the girls finishing 3rd, to both advance to the Regional Meet
- Plano Volleyball was the District Champion and advanced to the Regional Quarterfinals
- Plano West Volleyball finished 2nd in District and then made their first appearance at the State tournament
- West football advanced to the Bi-District round of the playoffs
- Plano Sr. Football advanced to the State Semi-Final game before losing in double overtime to eventual state champion Euless Trinity

Spring saw:

- Plano Sr. boys and girls win District Swimming Championships, and Plano West boys and girls finishing 2nd in District, the Plano East swim team advancing 14 to regionals. – Ultimately the Plano girls finished 3rd at the state meet, **with Genny Konicke winning the 50 Freestyle State Championship and placing 2nd in the 100 Freestyle.**
- In wrestling Plano West finished 2nd in District and sent 3 wrestlers to the State Meet
- Girls Basketball District Championship was won by Plano East, with Plano West finishing 2nd and Plano Sr. taking 4th, putting all three girls basketball programs in the playoffs.
- Boys Basketball saw Plano East and Plano West finish as Co-District Champions, with Plano East making it to the Regional Final and 3 points from a trip to the State Tournament

- In Soccer, the Plano East girls soccer team won the District Championship, and Plano West and Plano Sr. both advanced to the playoffs. Plano East continued on and lost a heartbreaker in the State Finals to cap off a tremendous year in girls soccer.
- Plano Sr. High and Plano East boys soccer both advanced to the regional quarterfinal round of the playoffs.
- Spring Tennis brought a 1,2, 3 finish of Plano Schools with District Championships by the Plano West boys and girls with 12 players advancing to the Regional tournament.

Plano East Boys were 2nd in the District and the girls tied for 3rd. The Plano Girls were also in that tie for third and advanced 3 players to the Regional tournament.

****At the State Tennis Tournament the Plano West boys doubles team of Chris Bell and Sergio Antognelli brought home the District's 2nd State Championship of the year coached by Morgen Walker!**

- In Track, the Plano West Girls were the District Champions and sent 13 athletes to the Regional meet, while Plano East sent 9 to the Regional and Plano sent their 4 x 400 Relay team.
- On the boys side Plano West had 6 athletes advance to Regionals, Plano Sr. had 3 boys advance, and Plano East had 11. **Last Saturday night Toddrick Allen of Plano East laid claim to the State Championship in the High Jump, leaping 6 feet, 10 inches, to be the State's best High Jumper!**
- Softball was again a 1,2,3 finish from the Plano Senior High Schools, with the District standings finishing with Plano Sr. in first, Plano West in 2nd, and Plano East in 3rd. All three did the District proud by advancing in the playoffs.
- Golf saw Plano East send one golfer to the Regional Tournament in Waco, while Plano West finished 1st in the District with both the girls and boys teams. At Regionals, the boys again won the tournament, while the girls finished 2nd, and then at State the girls finished 3rd and **the Plano West boys won the State Title! The team consisted of Ryan Daggeman, Alex Moon, John Rosener, Brett Spencer, and Sumin Yu, with Coach Rick Hardison at the helm!**
- Lastly in baseball, the Plano East squad tied for third in the District and advanced to the Bi-District round of the playoffs, while **Plano West won the District Championship and won the 5A State Championship, finishing the season with a 40-2 record!**
