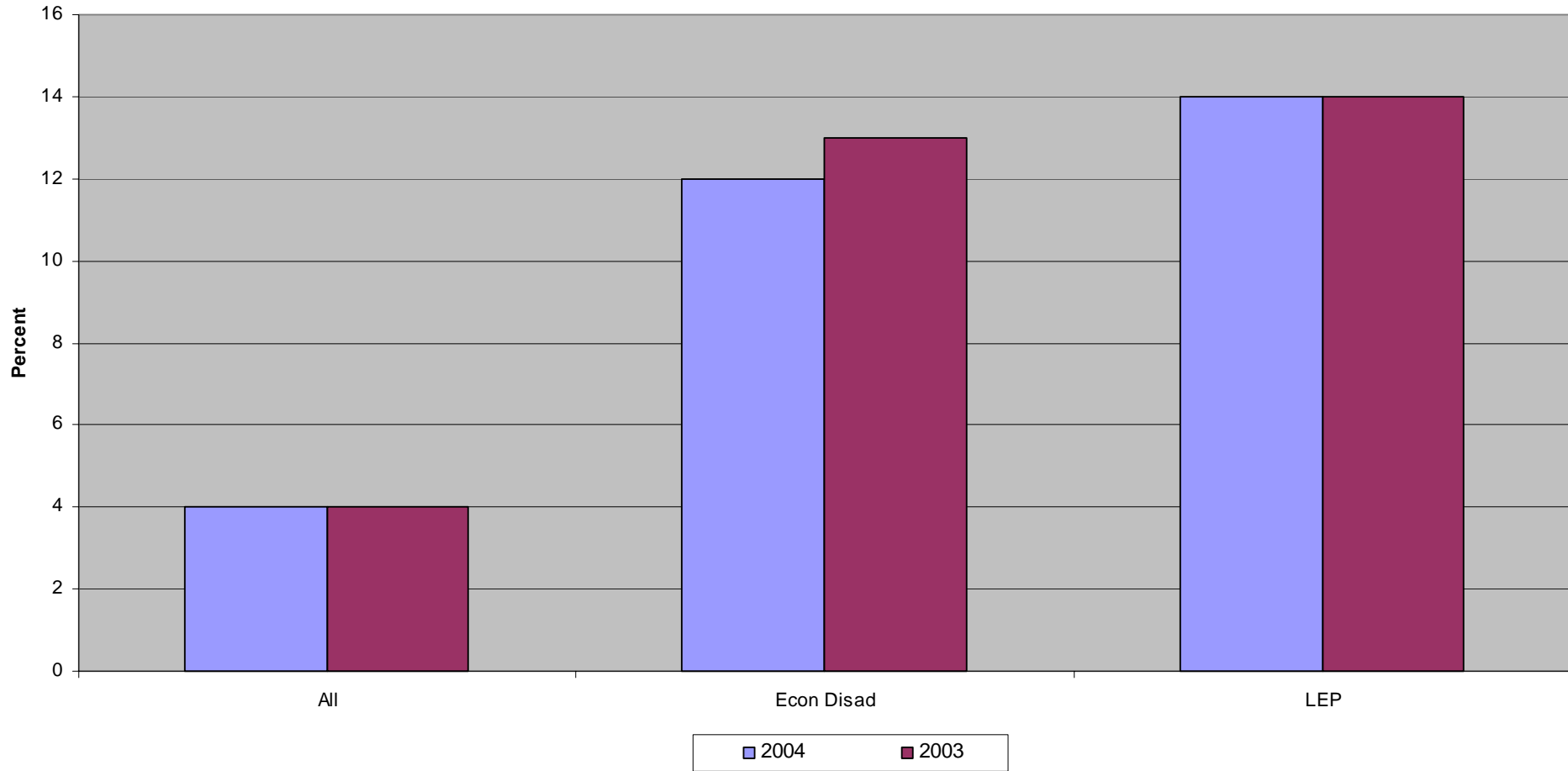


Grade 3 Students Requiring Accelerated Instruction

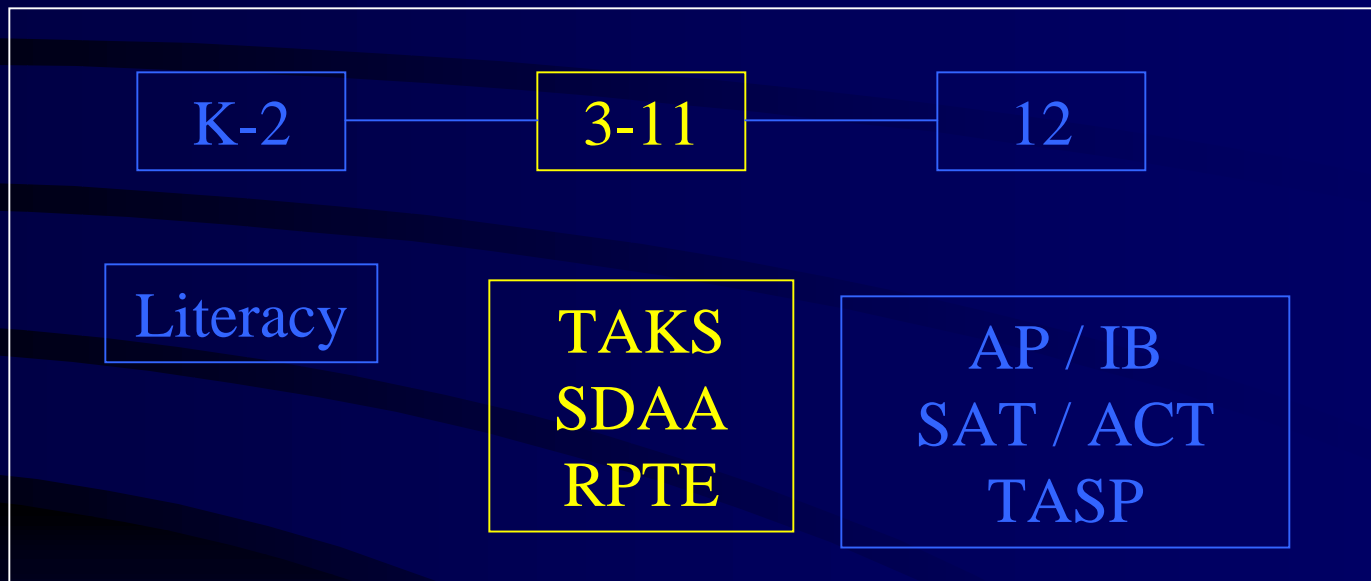

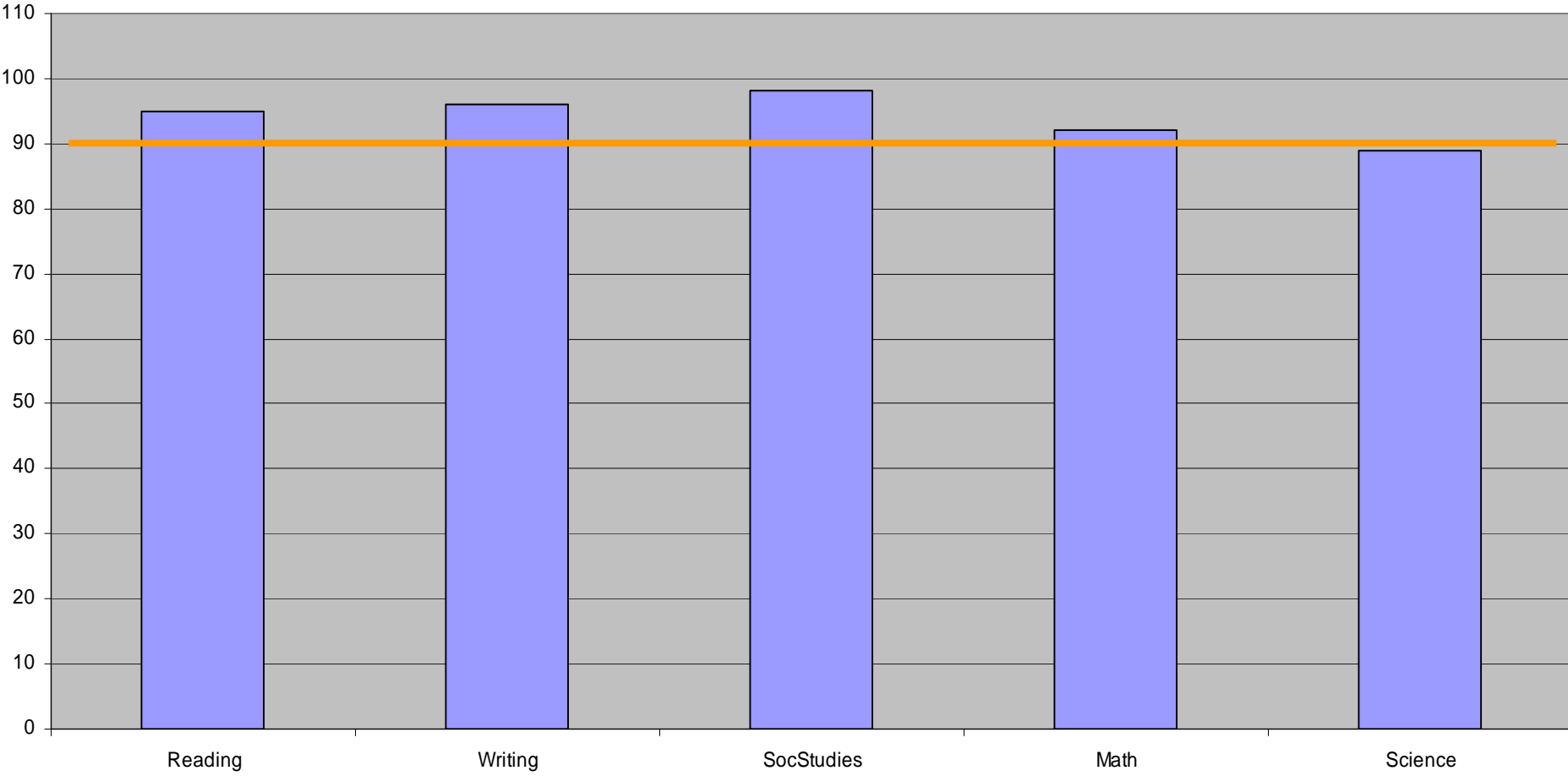

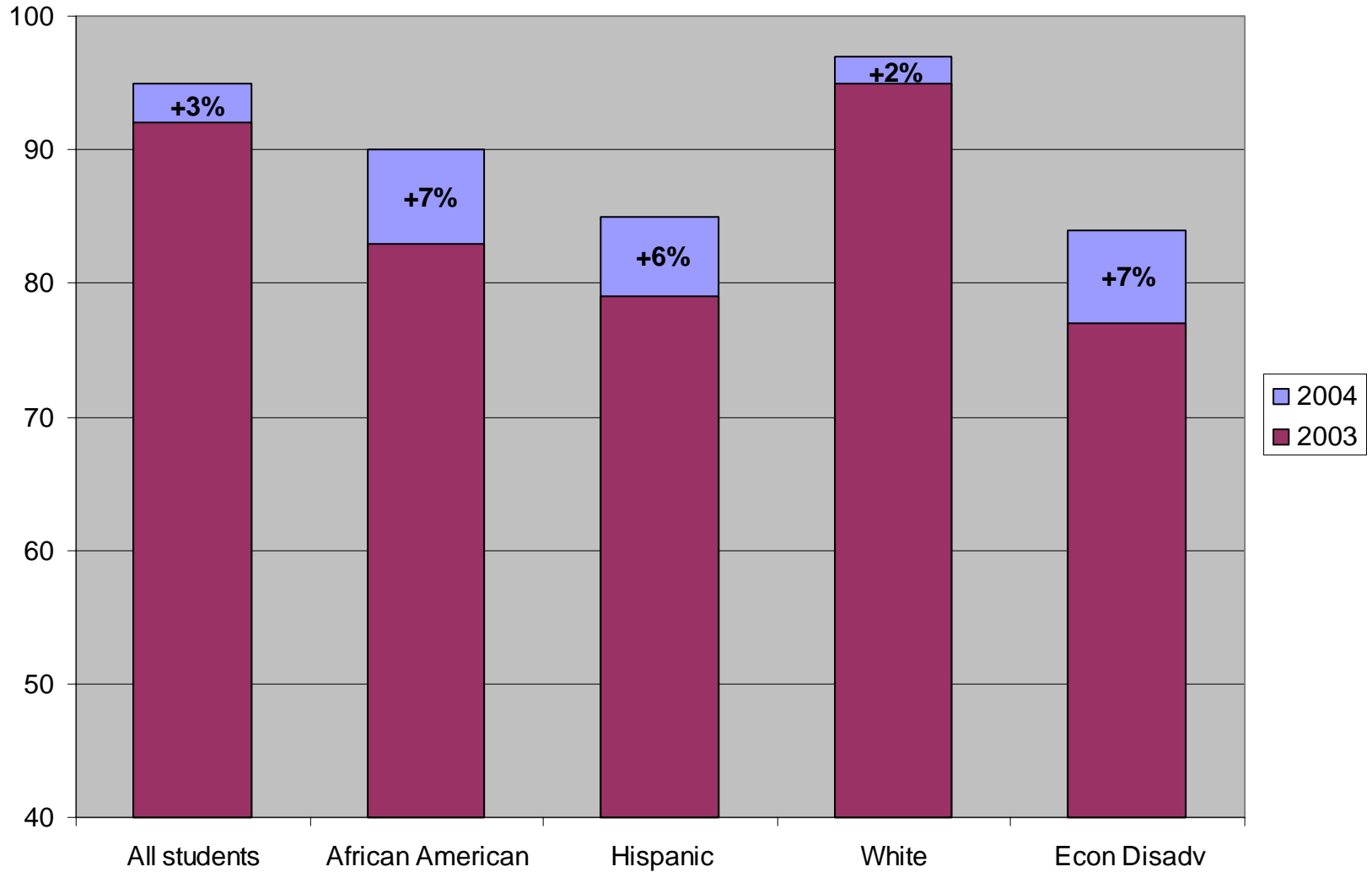

2004 Percent of ALL Students Meeting TAKS Standard



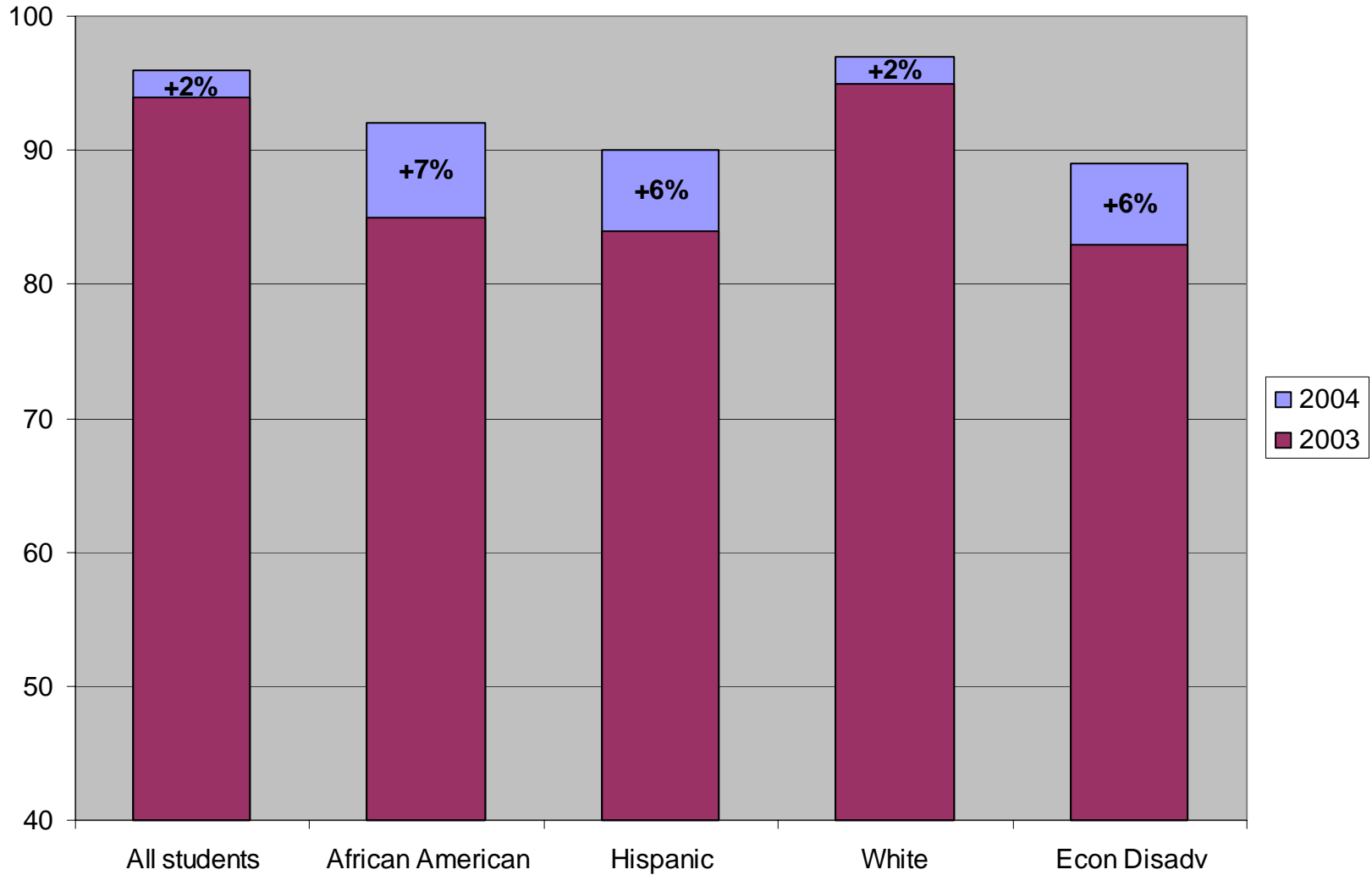

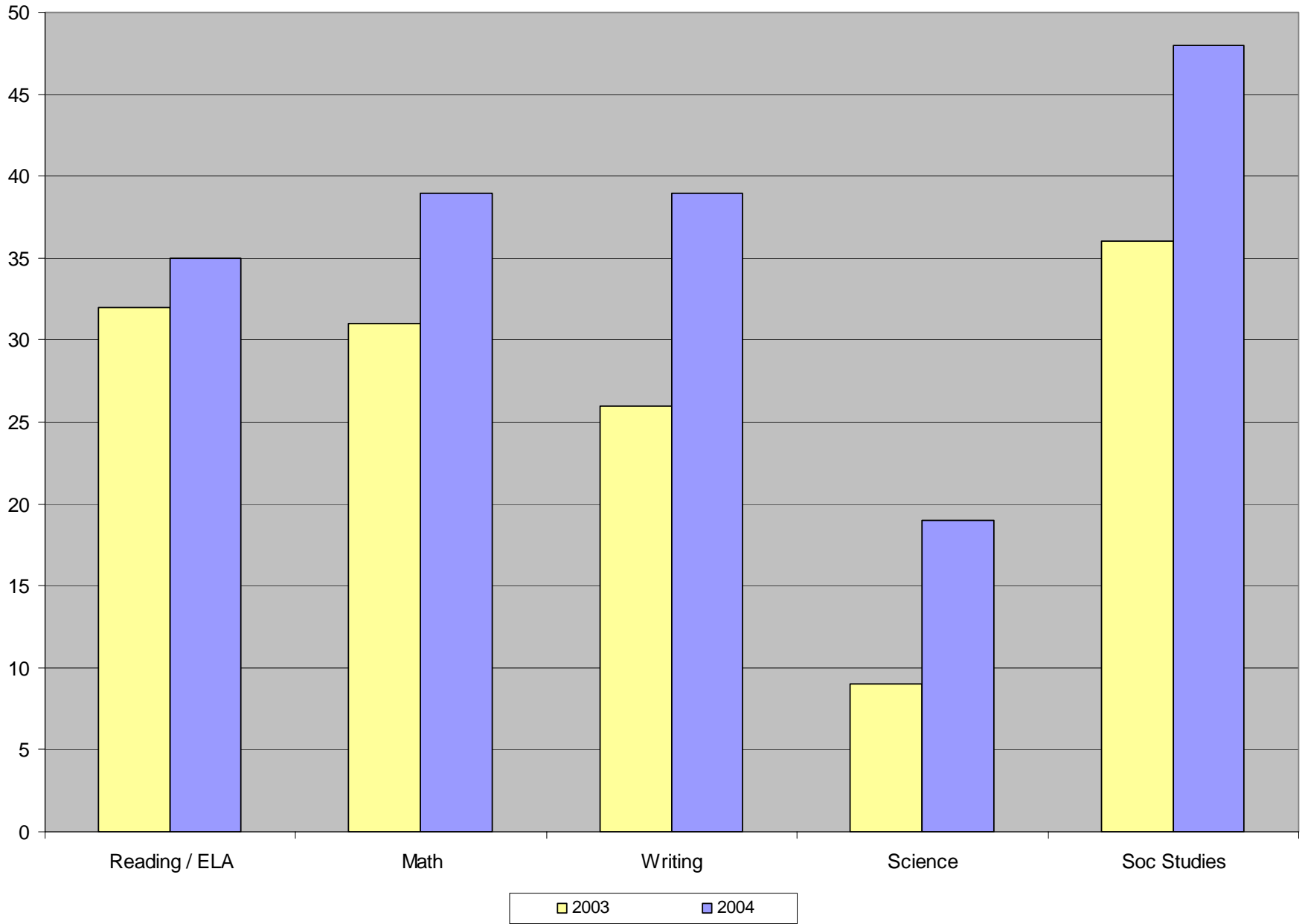
**Percent of Students Measured At Maximum Level of TAKS Achievement

Percent of PISD Students Measured At Maximum Level of TAKS Achievement

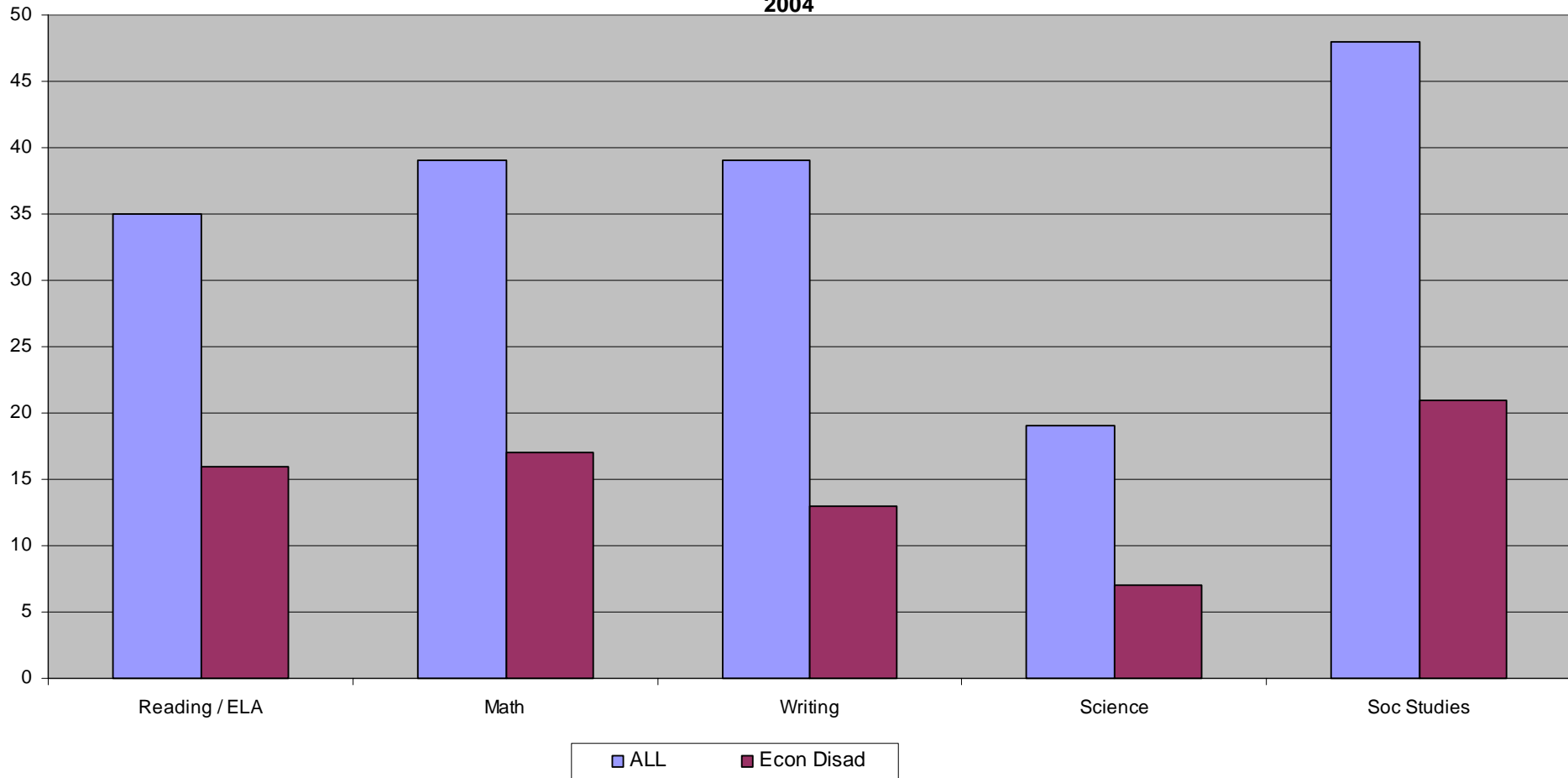


Percent of PISD Students Measured At Maximum Level of TAKS Achievement



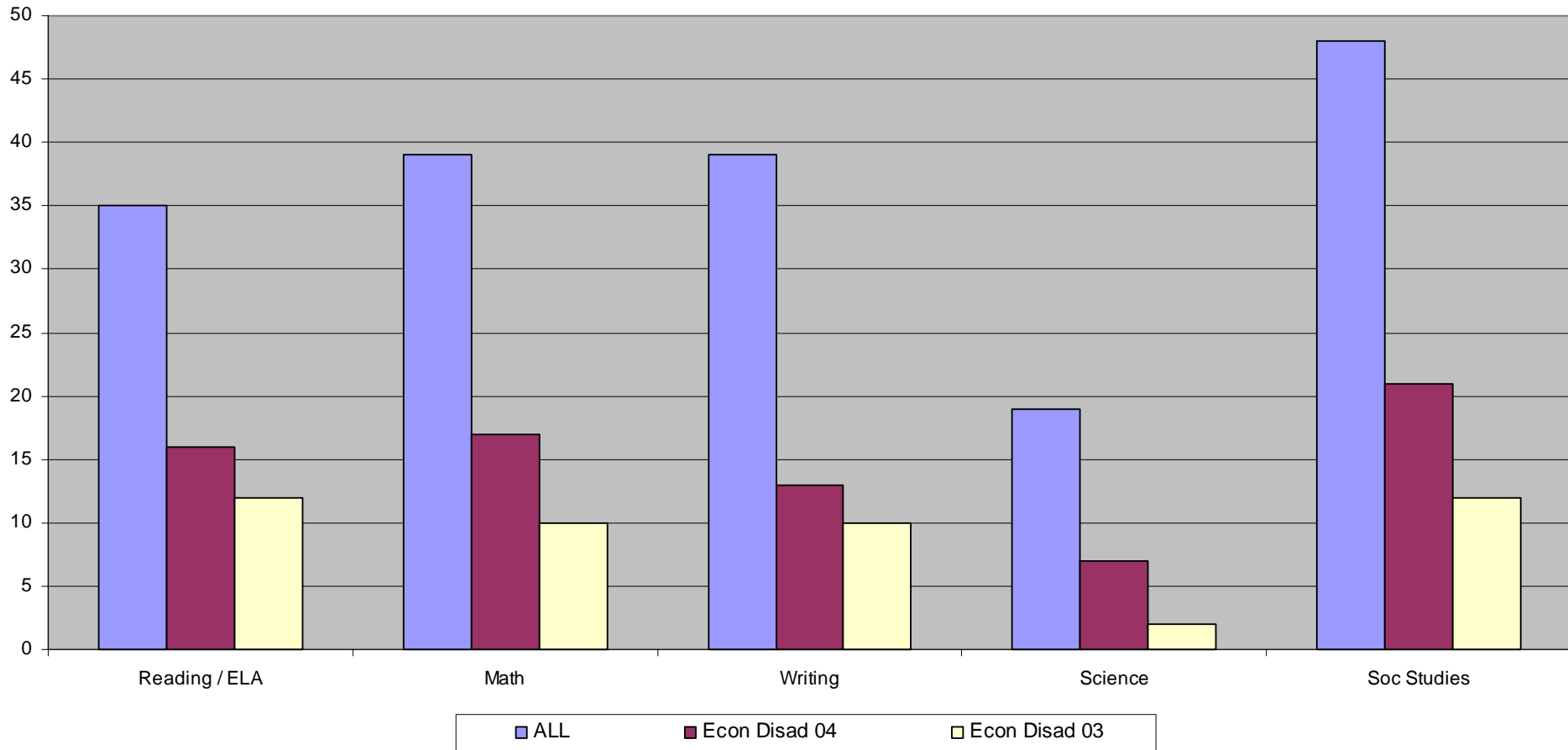

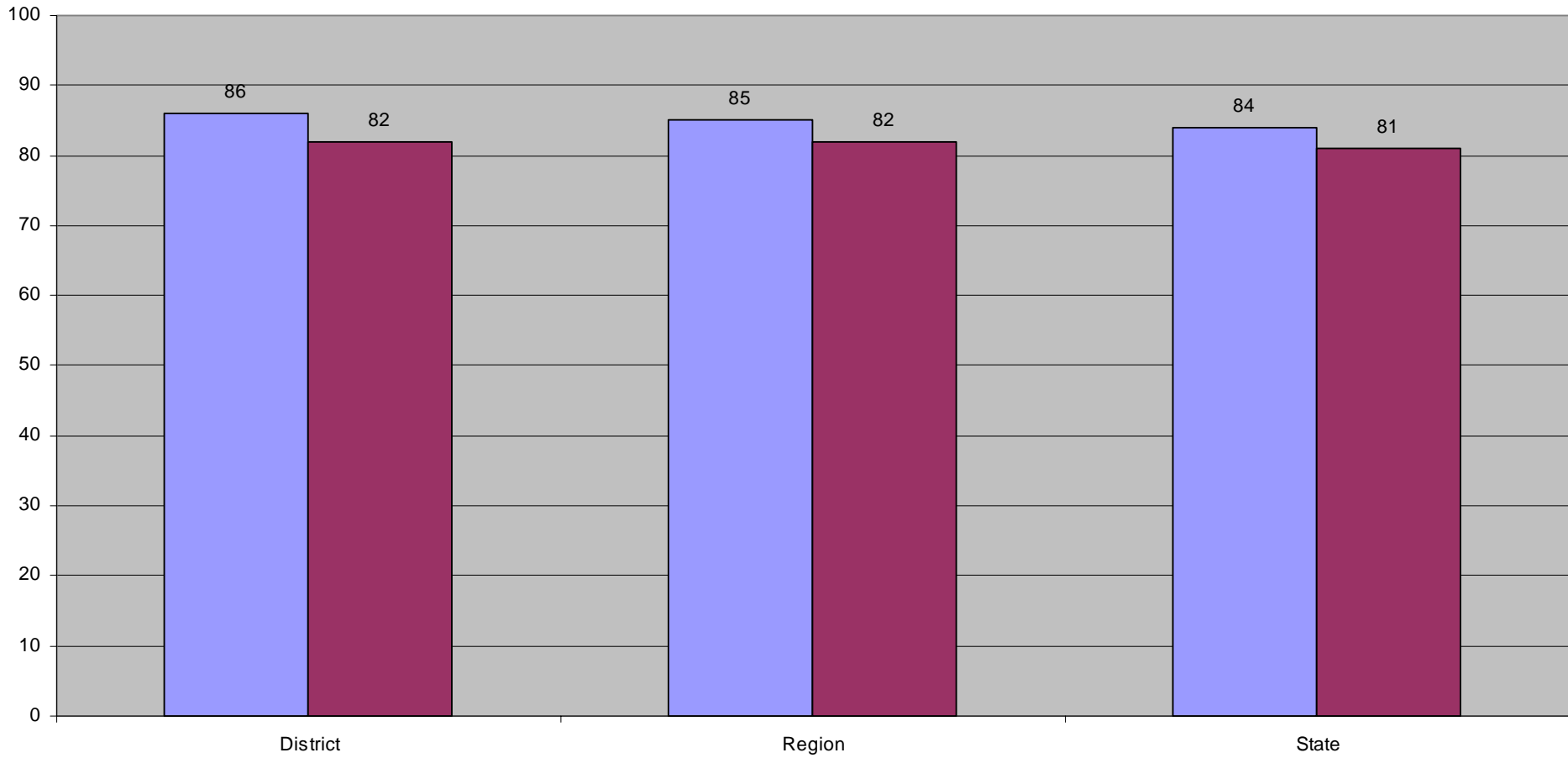
Gap Between All Students and Economically Disadvantaged Students On Percent of PISD Students Measured At Maximum Level of TAKS Achievement



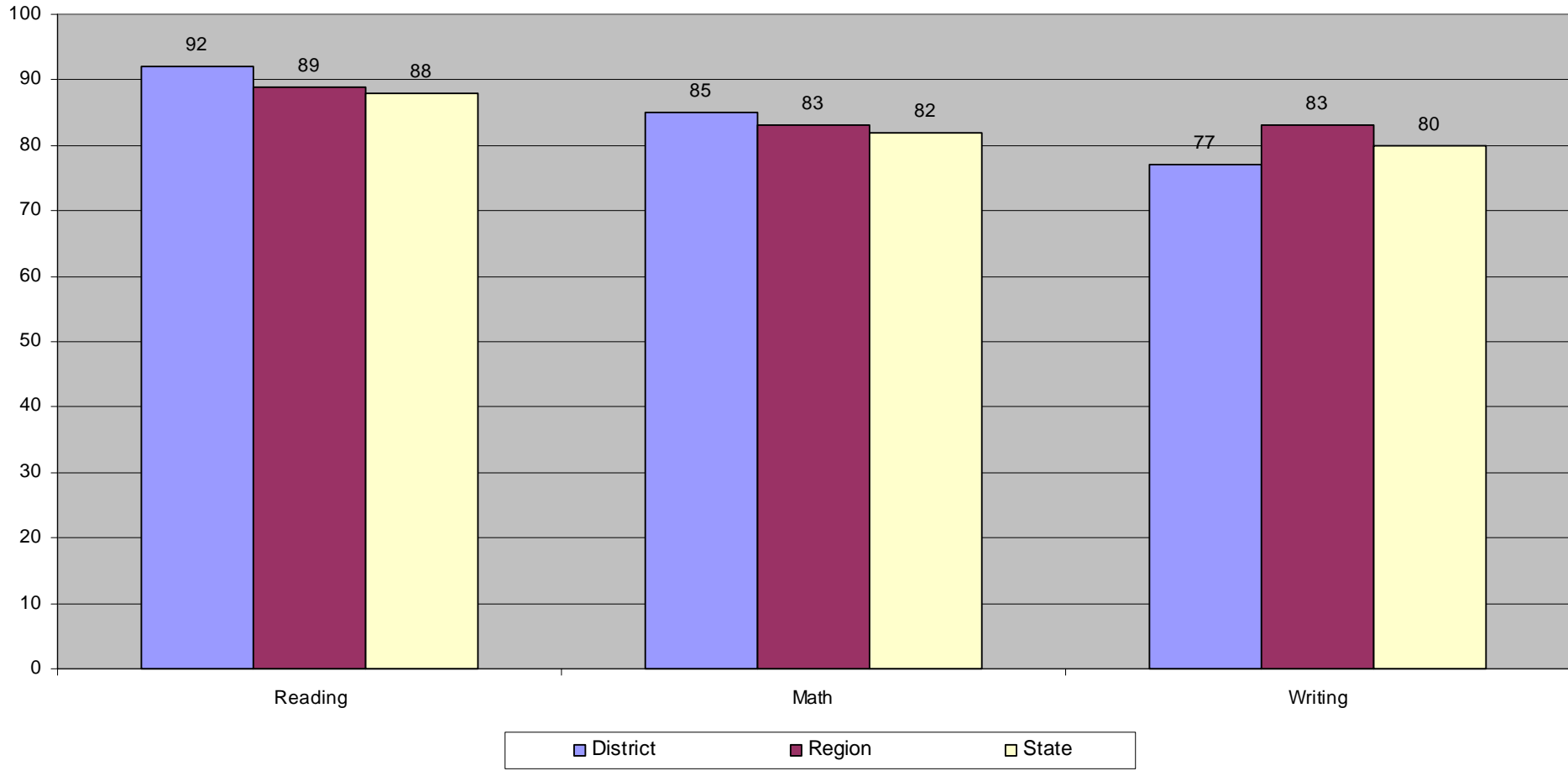

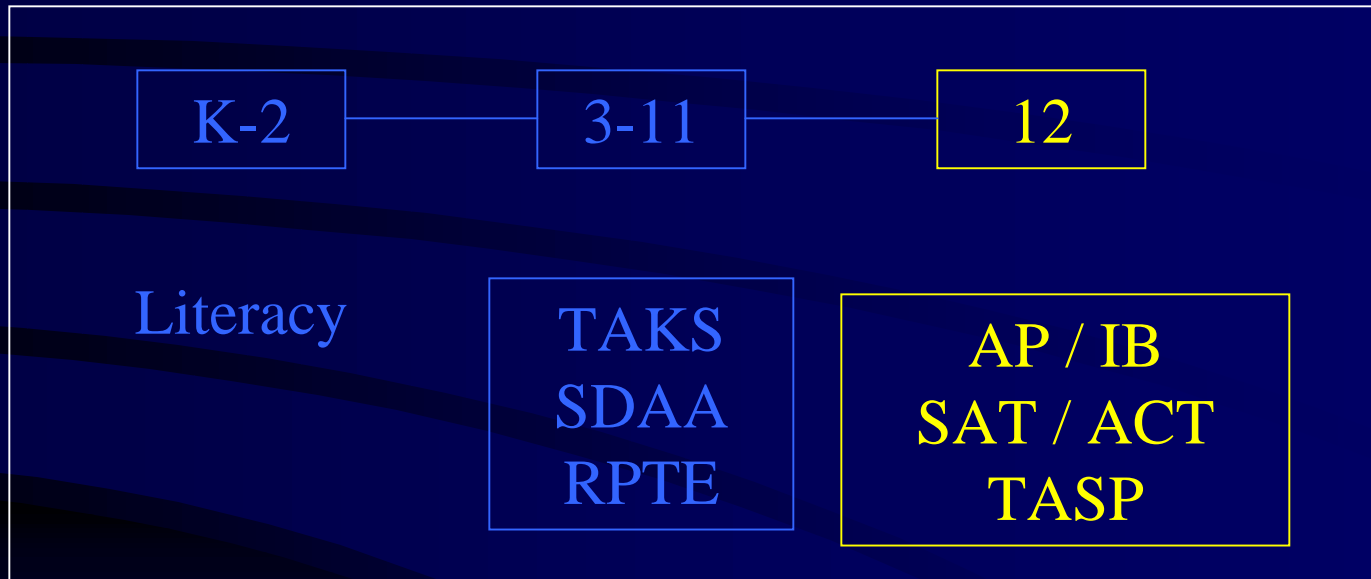
2004 RPTE Results of Beginning Students



2004 RPTE Results for Intermediate Students

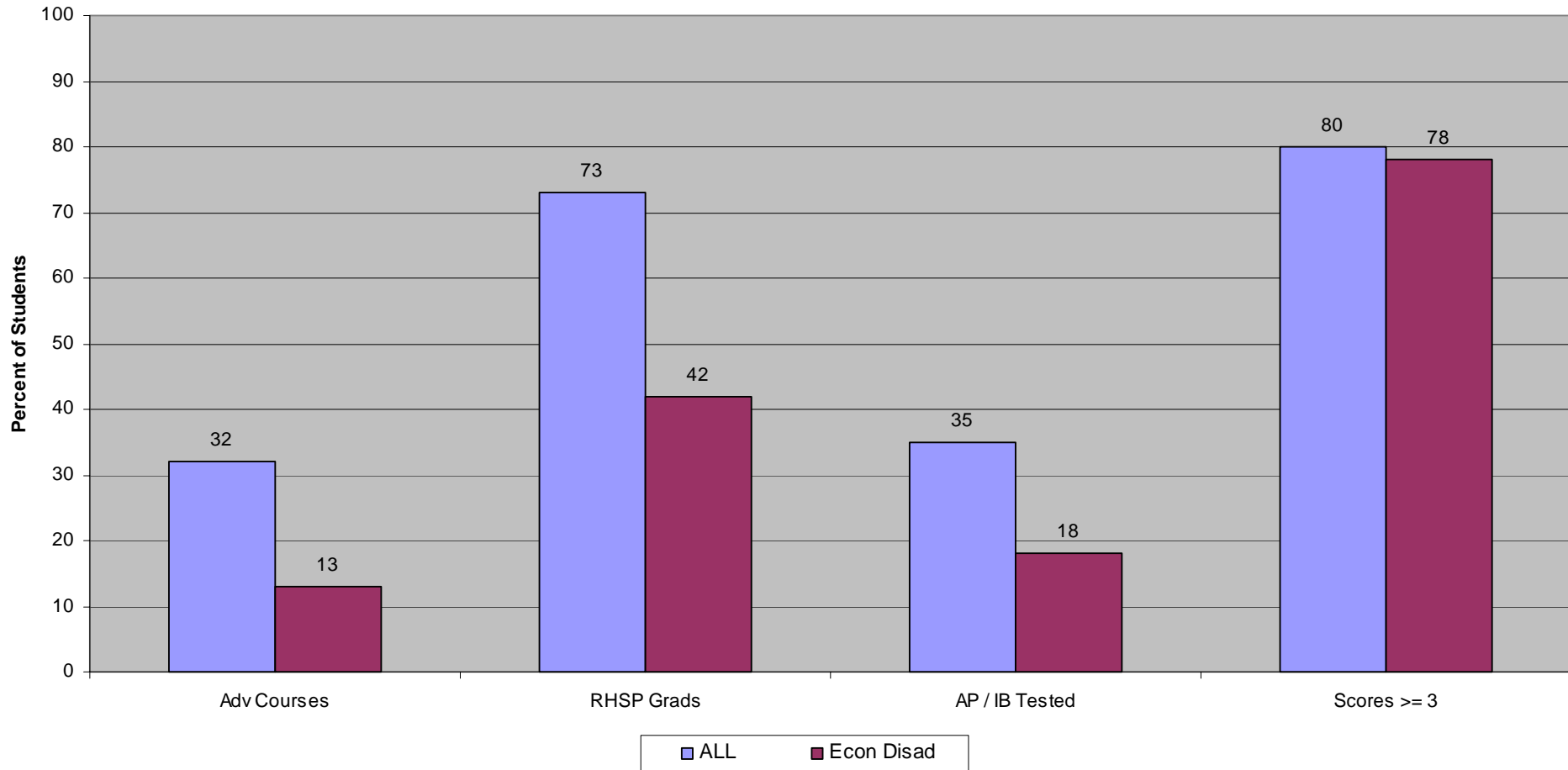

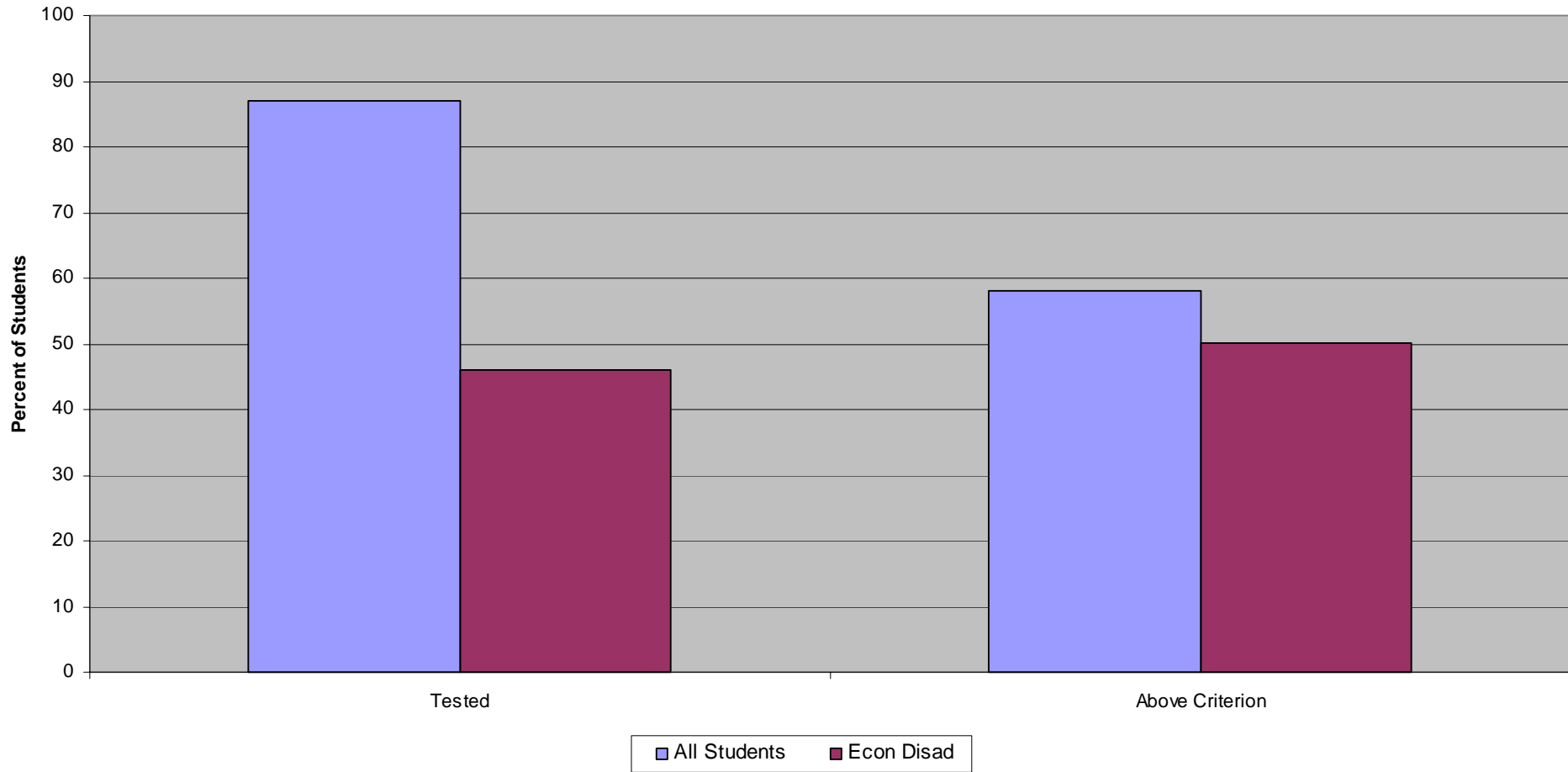

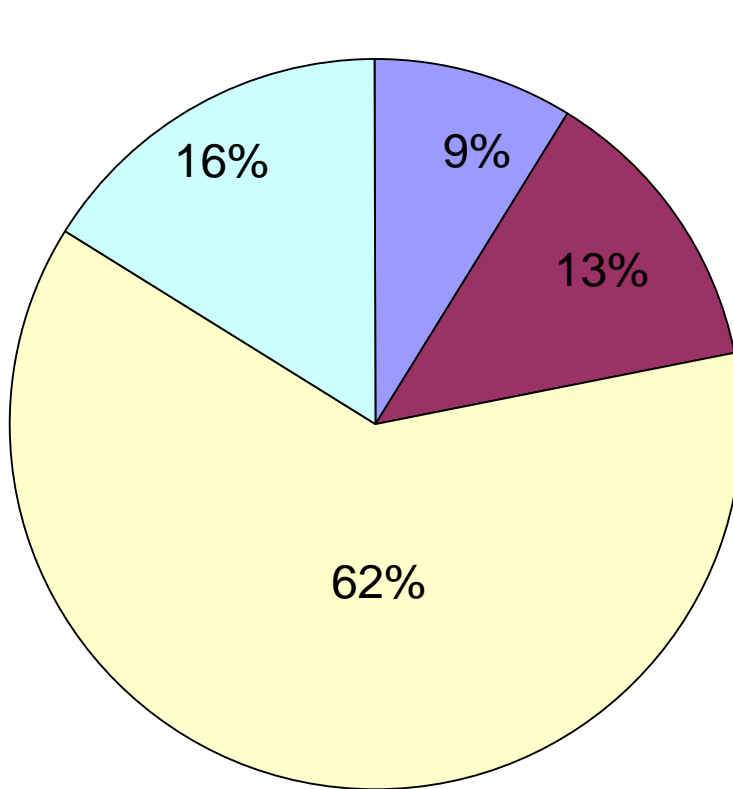

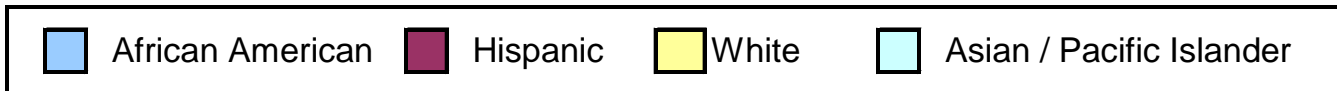
PISD Ethnic Distribution



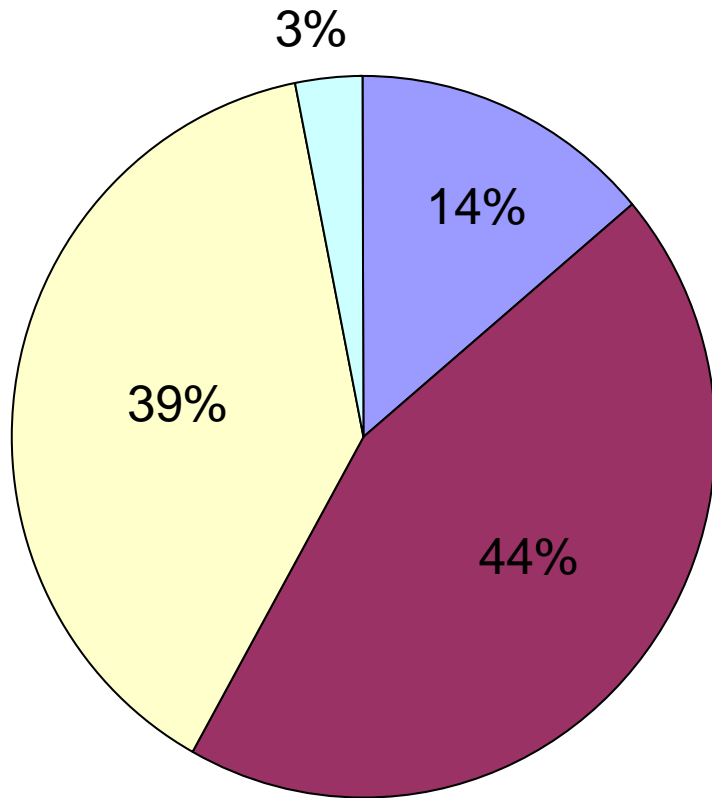

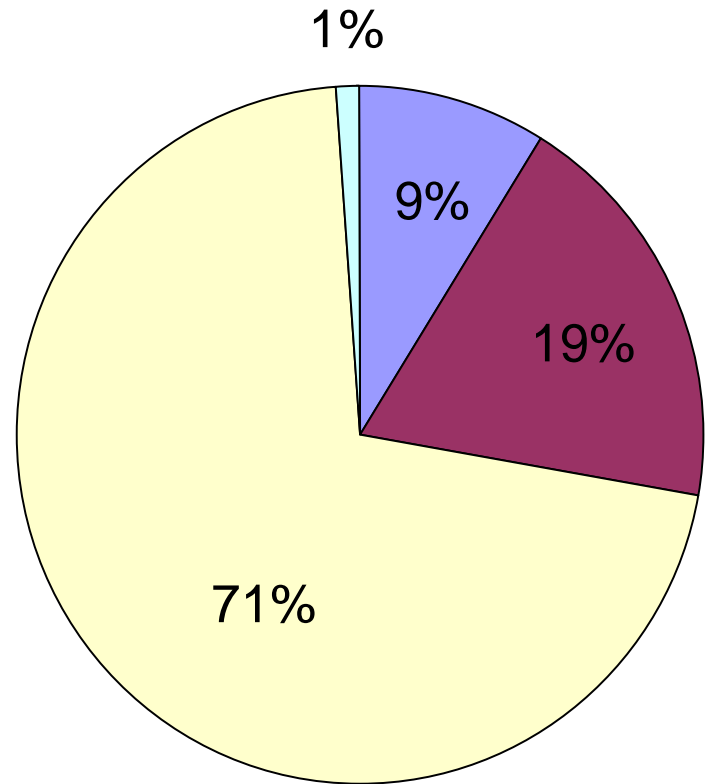

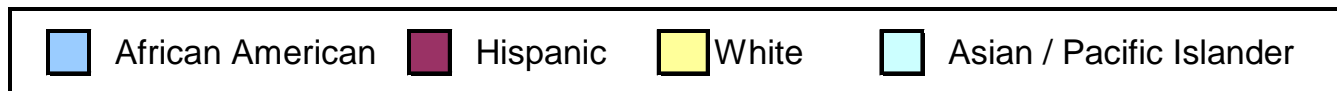
Texas Ethnic Distribution



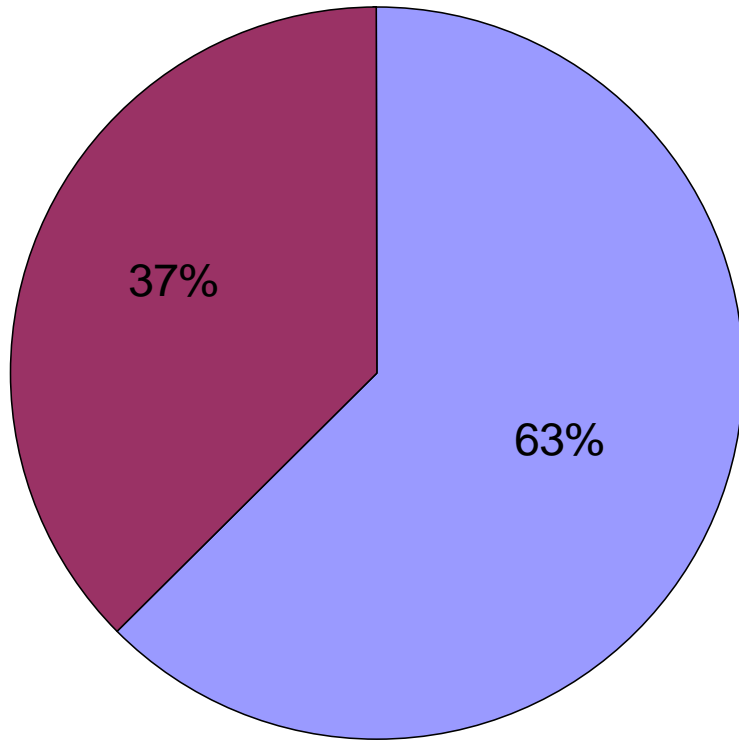

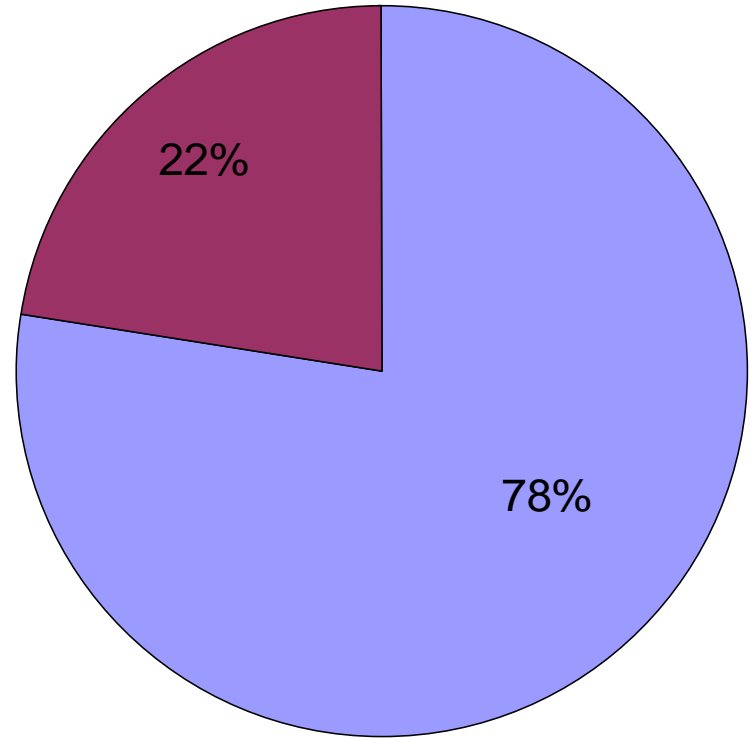

Teachers by Highest Degree Held



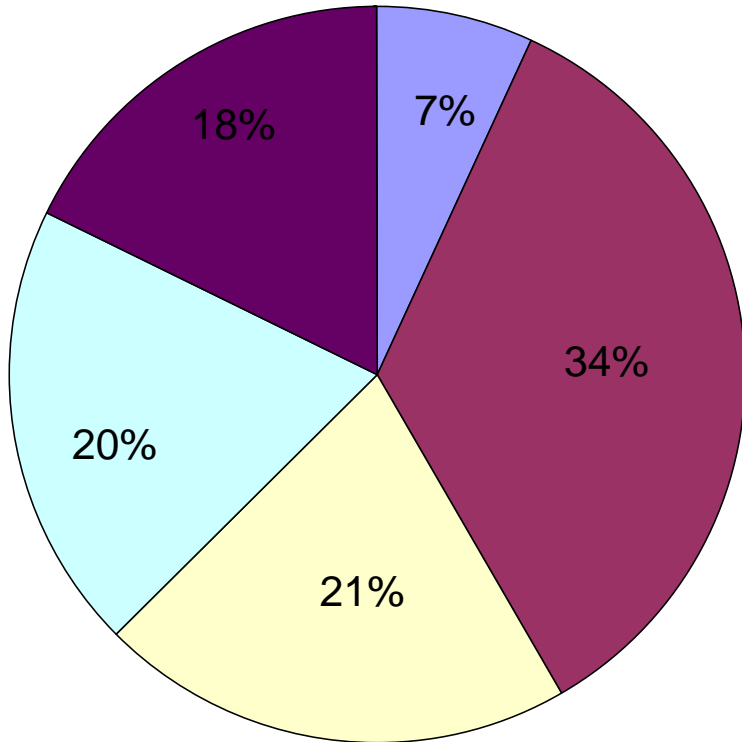

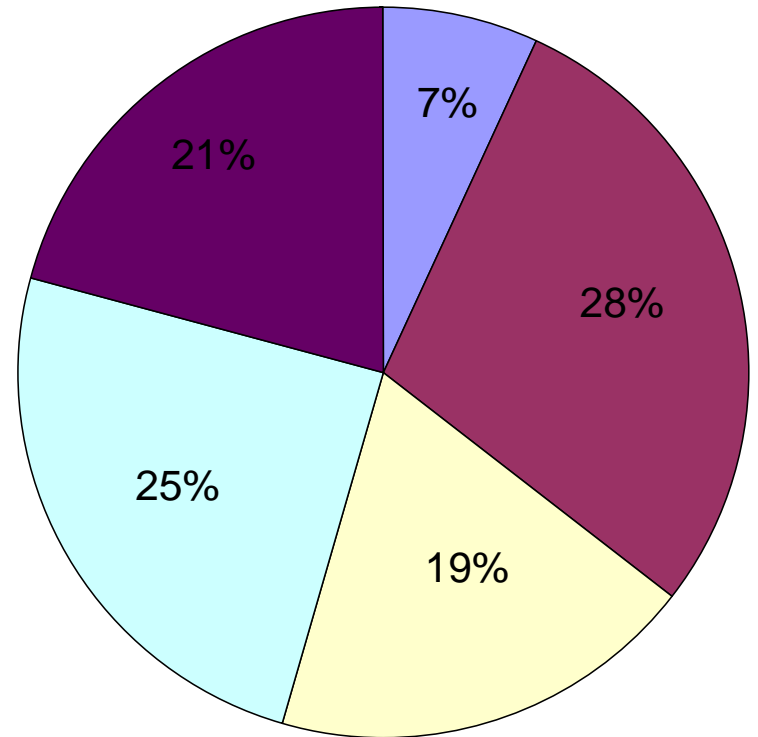

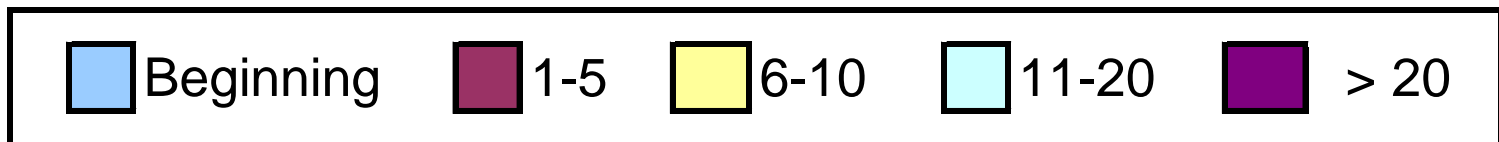

Safety & Security

Plano ISD has adopted as one of its goals the commitment to provide a safe and secure environment for students, staff and visitors. In an effort to accomplish this goal the district provides a comprehensive security program.

The district safety program is designed to provide students, staff and visitors with facilities that meet or exceed standards in fire safety, air quality, hazardous materials management, chemical safety and building safety.

Safety & Security Program

Plano ISD's comprehensive safety and security program includes:

- Uniformed police officers to provide traffic control on campuses where there is an indicated need.
- Uniformed police officers to provide security and law enforcement services at campuses, athletic events and after hours special events such as socials and dances.
- Police liaison officers assigned to secondary campuses with a goal of establishing a rapport between students and uniformed police. The officers also serve as counselors and instructors on matters involving law enforcement.
- Crime Stoppers Programs on all secondary campuses. This program is administered by students and is designed to teach them the need for citizen involvement in reporting and

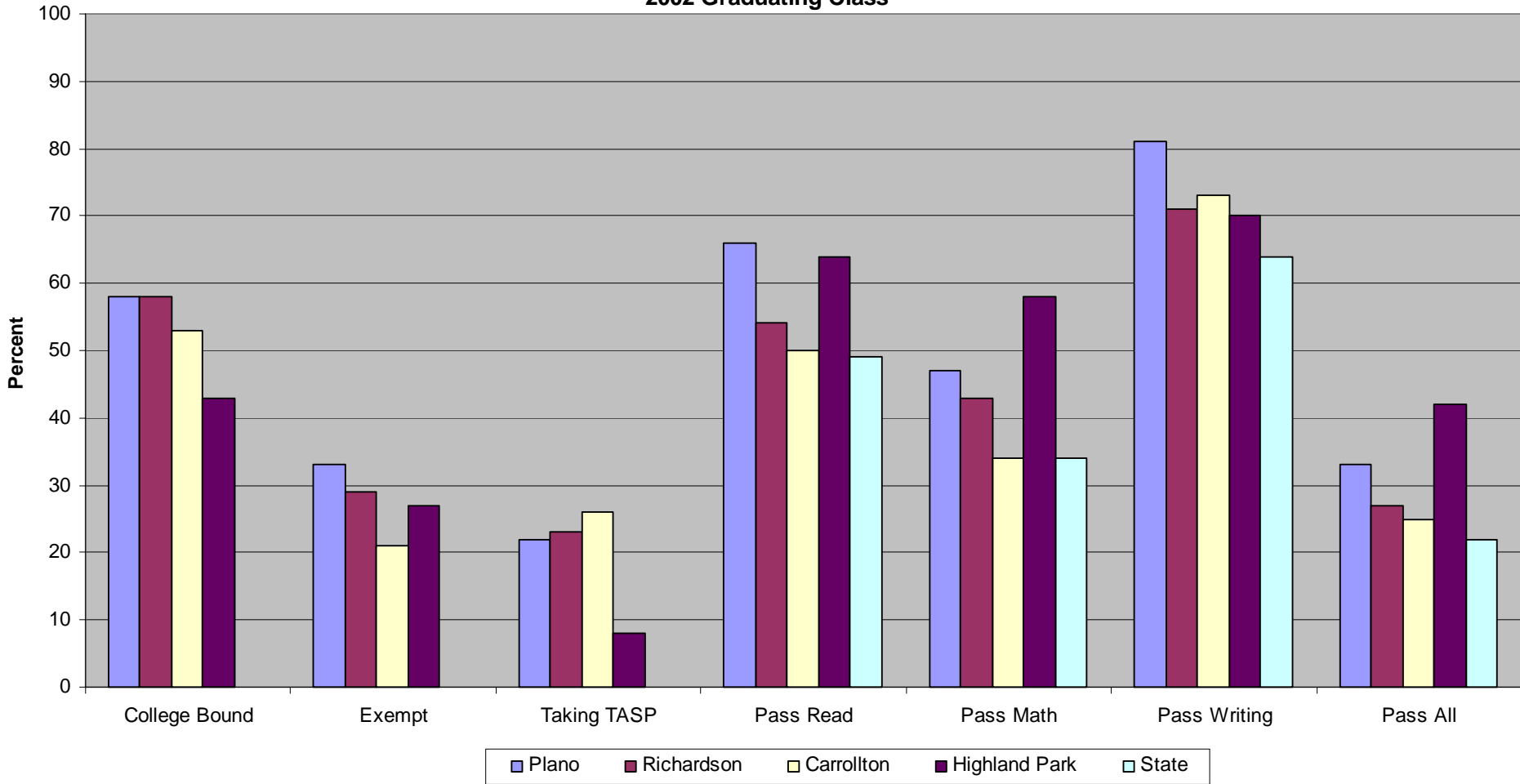
Goals	Measurement
1. Decrease substance use among students.	Maintained less than 1% rate of students using substances.
2. Increase community and parent involvement.	Maintained number of individuals (approx. 16,400).
3. Increase student involvement in school.	Increased involvement by 2,678 students (5%).
4. Decrease disruptive behavior.	Maintained rate of .05 incidents per child.
5. Reduce violence in schools.	Maintained rate of .02 incidents per child.
