

Corrections and Retake Policy

Math

Retakes will be available for all **unit tests**, once, for **up to a 90% in on-level classes** and **80% in honors classes**. Test corrections must be made to take advantage of the retake opportunity. If a quiz grade is lower than the first attempt on a unit test grade, then the quiz grade will be replaced by the unit test grade since they showed mastery of the concepts. Quiz grades will not be replaced based on the retake grade.

If a student wants to retake a test, then the following must be completed:

- Complete the correction form for each question missed on the test.
- Corrections forms will be turned in during morning or afternoon tutorials so the teacher can check the corrections for correctness. Any mistakes will be addressed and corrected.
- Once the corrections forms are complete and correct, the student will be able to retake the
 missed questions on a retake test. These will not be the same questions but it will assess the
 same skill. Retakes can only be completed during tutorials.
- After the retake test is graded, the test grade will be changed to reflect the content mastered. Only one retake is allowed.

History

Retakes will be available in Social Studies for all quizzes and unit tests for a grade of **up to 90%**. Any grade **below 70** will be mandatory tutoring for a retake. The following procedures are in place for those who would like to retake.

- Students must attend two review/corrections tutorials on dates scheduled by the teacher, prior to retaking the test.
- Students must then attend a third tutorial, scheduled by the teacher, to complete the retake

PACE project assessment grades do not qualify for retakes due to the collaborative nature and lengthy duration of the projects.

Science

Retakes are available up to one week after scores are returned to students.

- Students receiving an original score **below a 70** must attend a review tutorial prior to retaking their test. After attending the review tutorial, they will attend a second tutorial to complete the retake.
- Students receiving a grade **above a 70** are eligible to complete test corrections to receive one point back for each question originally missed to raise their grade **up to a 90**.

English

Test retakes are available for all students who would like to earn a higher grade for unit tests. Students retake the test to earn the full amount of points back after attending at least one tutorial session.

- Students who score below 70 will be required to attend tutorials and complete a retake. Parents will be contacted prior to tutorials.
- The grade will only be replaced if it's higher than the original.
- These are not test corrections, they retake a new test that covers the same objectives as the original.

English Writing CAPs can be resubmitted to their teacher after making corrections. Students will be given a separate due date for Writing CAP corrections to be submitted.

Office Hours

What are Office Hours?

Formally known as tutorials, office hours are a time for students to meet with their teacher in a small group setting before or after school. Students can ask questions they have about an assignment, get assistance starting or completing an assignment, or complete a retake.

Office hours are a great opportunity to help ease the transition from elementary school to middle school. Office hours are available for all students.

When are Office Hours?

All teachers will host two office hour opportunities; one before school and one after school. The schedule is not set yet, but once it is we will send it out to you.

- Before School is from 7:50 am to 8:20 am
- After School is from 3:30 pm to 4:00 pm

Homework

- Students will have homework most nights. On average it should take about an hour.
- There is math homework every night, including Fridays.
- Students will need to set aside time to practice their instrument or voice.
- Any unfinished classwork may need to be completed at home if class time was not used wisely.
- If your student has questions about any homework or class assignment, they should contact their teacher via email or attend office hours the following morning to gain clarification.

Passing Period

- 3 minutes between classes
- All core classes are located in the 7th grade "U".
- Students are able to use the restroom and get water.
- Students will have a grace period (about 2 weeks) before tardies start
- Students with excessive tardies will be issued consequences from administration.

Arrival and Dismissal

- Doors open at 7:50 am
 - o If a student arrives before 7:50 am, they will wait outside until the doors open
 - o Breakfast is served in the cafeteria
 - o Students will report to their grade level common areas to socialize and hang out
 - o Office Hours are offered until 8:20 am
 - o They will be dismissed at 8:20 am to report to their 1st period class
- School starts at 8:25 am
- School ends at 3:30 pm
 - Students can wait outside to be picked up by car
 - o Students can walk home or ride their bike
 - Students will go to the bus
 - o Office Hours are offered until 4 pm

If your student is a car rider, drop off and pick up will take place in the carpool lane in the front of the building. Please follow the entrance and exit signs. The entrance will be closest to Jack Carter Park. The flow of traffic should come from Independence Parkway. There are no left turns into or out of the car pool lane onto Maumelle. The bus lane and staff parking lot in the back will not be used for student drop-off or pick-up.

Personal Technology

- Cell phones and personal devices are not allowed in the classrooms, hallways, bathrooms, or at lunch.
- If a student is caught using their cell phone during one of these times, it will be taken up and placed in the front office to be picked up at the end of the school day.
- Cell phones and personal devices are allowed before school until 8:20 am and then powered
 off and put away.

School Issued Chromebook

- All students will be issued a Chromebook and charger.
- It is expected that it comes to school every day, charged. Students should bring their charger to school every day. There are no extra chargers in the classroom.
- This is a school-issued device and should not be damaged or written on. Stickers should not be placed on the device.

Lunch

- 11:00 11:30 (30 minutes)
- Occurs based on 5th Period Teacher
- Students can bring a lunch or buy a lunch.
- If a parent brings a lunch, it is dropped off in the front office and your student will pick it up from the front office at the start of their lunch.
 - o Parents are only allowed to bring lunch for their student.
- No snack time during middle school.
- Students are allowed to eat a healthy snack during the passing period.
- No food or candy is allowed in the classrooms.

Dress Code

- Shorts, including athletic shorts, must extend beyond the buttocks.
- Excessively loose or tight garments are not acceptable.
- Underwear-type sleeveless shirts, spaghetti straps, tank/tube tops are not permitted.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Sunglasses, caps, hats, raised hoods, etc are not permitted.
- Students in violation of the student dress and grooming code will be expected to change to appropriate attire or will be subject to other disciplinary action.

What does this really mean? What issues have we seen?

- Crop Tops If your student raises their hand and you can see their stomach, the shirt is too short and will be asked to change.
- Shorts and Skirts Bottoms must cover the entire buttocks area.
- Hoodies Students can wear a jacket with a hood, but the hood must remain off their head during the school day or the student will have to take off the jacket.
- Hats Any item that covers the head is not allowed. This includes baseball caps, beanies, etc.
 Religious coverings are allowed.

Clubs

- Clubs and organizations are open to all grade levels.
 - Whiz Quiz, Speech and Debate, School Play/One Act Play, Robotics Club, etc.
- Any student can start a club based on any interest
 - Students must find a teacher sponsor and complete a registration form before they can begin to meet
 - o There will be more information regarding student-led clubs during Panther Pride Time.

Panther Pride Time (PPT)

- 6th Period
- 30 minutes a day
- All students will be assigned a Panther Pride Time teacher.
- This class is our version of advisory.
- Students will join and participate in a club weekly.
- Students will be challenged with team-building activities.
- There will be learning enrichment, study hall, and tutorial opportunities.
- Students will continue to learn about their social, emotional, and mental health.

Student ID Badge

- All students will be required to wear their student ID badge at all times. This is a district policy for the safety and security of our campus.
- It must be visible on a lanyard around their neck.
- A lanyard will be provided, but your student is welcome to use a lanyard that represents their interests.
- Badges should not be cut, bent, or covered with stickers. Damage to their badge will result in needed replacement.
- The initial badge is issued for free. Replacement badges are \$5. Replacement badges are issued from Mrs. B in the front office.
- If your student forgets their badge, they should report to the front office and Mrs. B will issue a temporary sticker badge good for that day only.
- Persistent badge issues may result in consequences issued by administration.
