Please Note Flipgrid is available to use on all platforms: iOS, Android, and web. If using a mobile device the Flipgrid app must be used to add a response. Teachers will need to access the Flipgrid admin with the web or browser on your mobile device. In this ebook the screenshots are taken from the web version, but the functions described are very similar regardless of what device you are using.

Flipgrid Lingo



Grids

A Grid is your community of learners. Name your Grid and create a custom Flip Code (or use the auto-generated one). Educators will now select an option for Grid community type:

[School Email Domain](#) - Students enter the Flip Code and verify their school email using Microsoft or Google.

[Student ID List](#) - Students enter the Flip Code and their unique ID or scan a QR code for verification.

[PLC and Public](#) - Allow anyone to view videos with just the Flip Code. To record a video, participants verify their email address via Microsoft or Google.

Topics

Topics are your discussion starters or prompts. Students respond to Topics.

Responses

These are the students' videos they record or upload and add to the Topic. This is how they share their voice!

Replies

When activated, replies take the discussion one step further by allowing users to add a response or "reply" to a response that was added to the Topic.

Spark

Educators can spark any response into a Topic. This creates a new Topic in the grid based on that unique response as the Topic Resource.

Title

When submitting a response to a Topic it can be given a title. If a hashtag (#) is used this allows responses to be searched and sorted by title.

Stickie

These are digital sticky notes that can be layered onto your screen when recording a response.

Vibes

Custom messages or feedback provided by the educator, visible for all to see at the top of their video response in a Topic.

Creating a Grid

Once you create your account you will be walked through creating your first Grid. The great thing about Flipgrid is that it is laid out very nicely and is easy to use. Below are the steps you can come back to when needing to create more Grids.



The Grid Launchpad will open with three Grid Types to choose. Select the category that best fits your needs (see [Grid Types](#) on page 2) and click next. Follow the steps on the next pop up window depending on the Grid type.

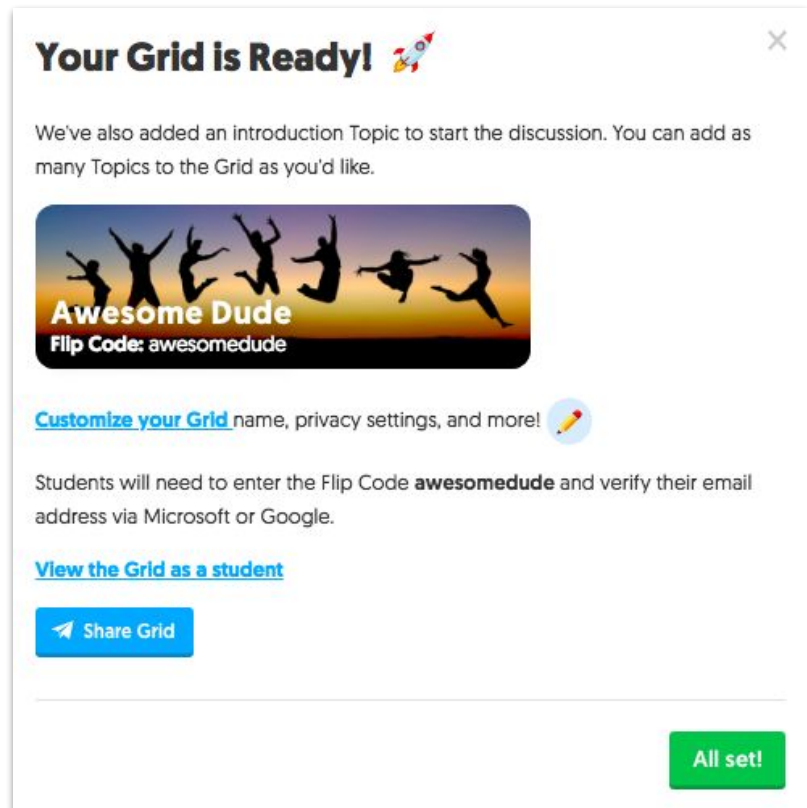

Adding Topics to Your Grids

Whenever you add a new Grid, it automatically creates an intro topic. Super awesome! To add more Topics and get more responses begin at the “My Grids” tab, select the name of the Grid you would like to add a Topic to, and select the blue New Topic button.

Add a title for your Topic to provide context.

Adjust the maximum recording time allowed in this Topic.

This date is displayed on your Topic and can be used to order your Topics.

Adjust the Response time to fit the needs of the Topic and your students.

New is the Topic Tip! It will be added to the Topic in bright red text next to the star.

You'll need to add a title and description/question to your Topic. These are required. The description or question is the prompt students will read to know what to respond to.

With Video Moderation turned on, responses to a Topic will not be seen publicly until approved.

Topic Privacy

Video Moderation
If videos are moderated, you must approve them before becoming visible to others.

Grid Community Type
You have selected **School Email Domain** which means students enter a Flip Code and verify their school email using Microsoft or Google. Edit this Grid's **Community Type** under Grid settings.

Add a Topic resource (video, image, gif, or emoji) to engage your learners.

Bring life to your Topic by adding a Topic Resource! It's an optional setting, but will help getting your students engaged in your Topic.

Attach up to 5 external links (OneNote, Google Docs, Dropbox, etc.) to this Topic.

Add another Attachment

Add a file attachment as an extra resource for your students when they are preparing to add a Response. This could be a HyperDoc, an image, website, etc. In the most recent update, you can add up to 5 attachments.



Adding Topics cont...

Make sure and customize the Video Features you would like your learners to have access to whenever submitting responses and when watching responses that have been added to the Topic.

Video Features

Selfie Decorations

Allow students to decorate their selfies with drawings and stickers. Decorations can be individually selected or disabled entirely.

Stickers and Drawings

Attachment Link

Allow students to include an external link (OneNote, YouTube, news article, etc.) with their video. Links can be public (visible to all), private (only visible to you), or none.

Public

Video Reactions 🗣️

Allow students to react with a mic drop emoji, Flipgrid's version of a like.



Student-to-Student Replies

Allow students to Reply via video to another student Response.



Video Views

Display the number of views a video has received.



Video Title

Allow students to add a title (80 characters max) to their video. Titles can include hashtags for searchability.



Choose a feedback setting for student Responses. This feature is to allow private educator feedback to students. The basic feedback is the default setting, while Custom Feedback allows educators to create their own rubrics.

Responding to Topics

You have two options when adding a response to a Topic. Record a response using your device's camera or upload a previously saved video from a file. Either way follows the same basic steps.

Click this icon to display the topic's prompt and resource. Click and drag it anywhere on the screen.

New to the Flipgrid recorder is **MyView!** This is a feature that will be more noticeable in responses recorded on mobile. Sometimes students record horizontally or sometimes they record vertically. Sometimes students record horizontally and vertically all in one video. MyView magically moves the Flipgrid video player to match your students' creativity!

Use the digital stickies to help outline a response and not to forget what you'd like to say. Add as many as you need and click to drag them anywhere.

Responding to Topics cont...

The most important part of Flipgrid is recording the video. And, while Flipgrid made it super simple to record before they somehow made it even easier and gave us even more recording abilities (or superpowers as they like to call them =)

Trimming! Did you forget what you were going to say at the end of the video? Someone drop in unexpectedly at the end of your recording? Trim it!

Title your video! You can also add a hashtag to your title which helps when you are filtering videos. Try class hashtags like #period1 or subject hashtags like #GRA18.

Add More! When you Trim the beginning or end of your video, you'll unlock additional recording time.

Add an attachment to your video! This can be any URL or link to a G Suite or Microsoft file!

Ideas ⚡




Living at the top of each new Grid is the Ideas bar. It's located right under your Grid Cover photo. Ideas is a hub for your students to share about what they are thinking, reading, watching, doing, or creating with their learning community. ***It gives students the freedom to share their voice anytime!***

In the Educator Dashboard, Ideas appear as a Topic with all other Topics you've added to a Grid.

Don't want Ideas available to students? You can deactivate or freeze the Ideas bar anytime in the Grid Details.

Select edit and you can customize Ideas like all the other topics. Edit the question displayed on the grid. Also you can enable or disable Moderation, Student-to-Student Replies, Video Reactions, Stickers, and Attachments!

1 Topic

This is your space to share ideas and thoughts with your learning community! Share what you are reading, watching, doing, creating, or thinking. Have fun!

Students can add an Idea by clicking the icon located at the top of the Grid. Once selected, students add a response just as if responding to a normal topic!

The question or prompt you provide in the Ideas Topic is displayed front and center so it is easily seen.



Spark

Have a student response that is out of this world or very thought provoking? Educators can spark any response into a Topic. This creates a new Topic in the grid based on that unique response as the Topic Resource.

In the Educator's Dashboard, go to the Grid, then Topic of the student response you want to Spark into a topic. Using the actions dropdown for that response, select Spark Response. This will open a window to edit and create the Topic. After sparking a response a flame icon will appear on the response selfie.

Vibes

Educators can provide custom messages or feedback to students that are visible for all to see. Vibes will be shown at the top of their video response in a Topic.

In your Educator's Dashboard, go to the Grid, then Topic and select the student response. Click the "Leave a Vibe" that is populated on the response. After adding your vibe select to update the response.

Examples of Vibes:

- AWESOME DUDE (Claudio Z)
- ROCK ON (Joe M)
- BECAUSEBIMMERLE (John B)
- MAGICAL! (jen s)

Another great way to highlight a student response is to feature it. By clicking the star by the response in the Educator's Dashboard, it will place that response at the top of the Topic responses when the topic is viewed as a student.

Providing Student Feedback

Just click on a student's response in the Educator's Dashboard to provide private feedback to that student.

Instead of replying to the student on the topic and seen by all, you can give private video feedback.

Using the Grading Rubric you selected when setting up the topic (basic or custom), score your students' responses and leave them a text comment.

Two options to send private feedback to students. Email is the default or you can send by a link. Using a link is a great option for students that don't have emails.

Two great resources to help create your own custom rubrics!

Erik Palmer, author of Well Spoken, provides rubrics using PVLEGS (poise, voice, life, eye contact, gestures and speed). Use these rubrics as a guide to create your own and provide custom feedback to your students.

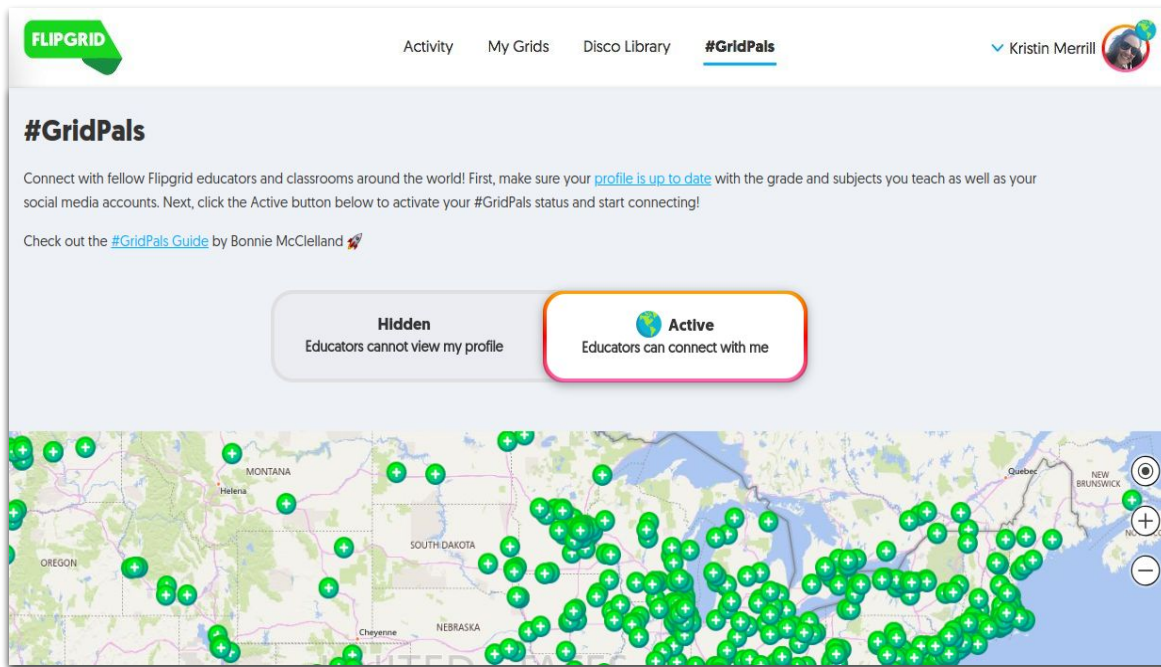

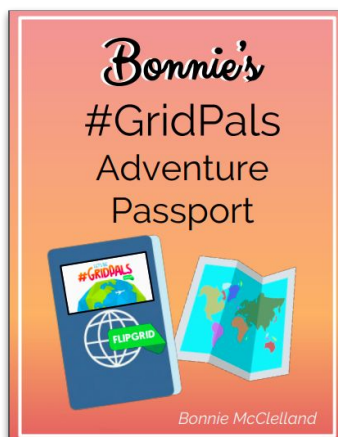


GridPals

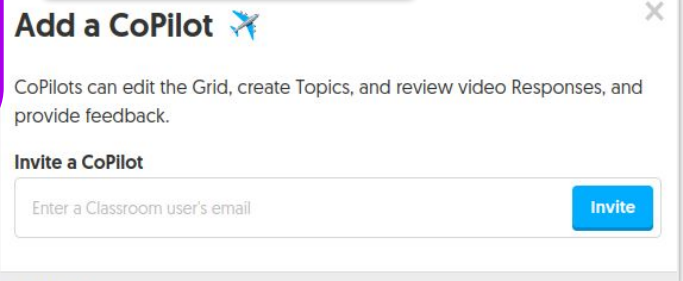


CoPilots

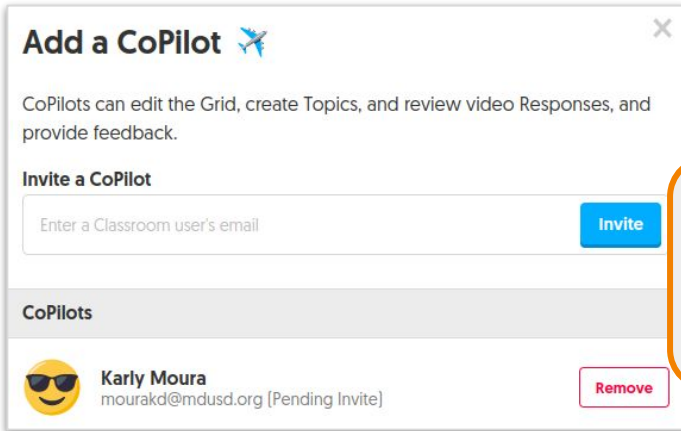
With the CoPilots feature educators can invite others to co-manage a Grid. Copilots can essentially do everything the Grid creator can, except delete the Grid or add more CoPilots. A Grid CoPilot could be anyone! A teaching partner, administrator, or a GridPal.



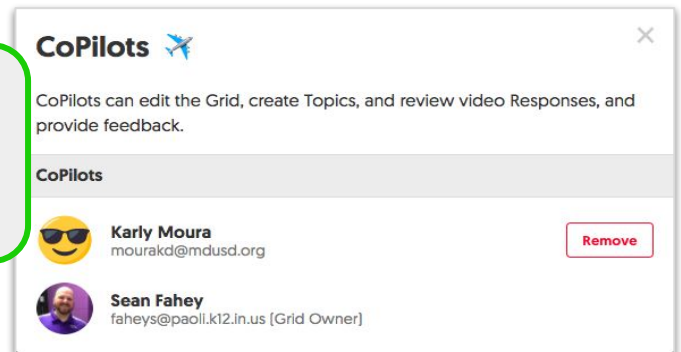
It's easy to add a CoPilot to your Grids! In your Dashboard click on **My Grids**. Select the Grid you would like to add a CoPilot to. Click **Add CoPilots** and enter the email address of other Flipgrid users. They will receive an email and a notification at the top of their Educator Dashboard.



You can easily manage your CoPilots within your Dashboard. Click on the **CoPilot** icon in your **Grid Details**. This will display how many CoPilots you already have and allow you to remove or add more CoPilots.



CoPilots can click on the CoPilot icon in the **Grid Details** also. This will show who the CoPilots are for that grid and gives the CoPilot the option to remove themselves from the grid.



Once you have added CoPilots to your own Grid, or have become one on another Grid, the Grid will be displayed with all your others in the **My Grids** section of the Dashboard. A special icon will show that that grid includes CoPilots and your profile pictures will be displayed on the Grid.



If this Grid is being used for a GridPals connection, the CoPilot can now add their email domain or student ID list to the Grid so students can access and add their responses.



Discovery Library



Flipgrid understands the power of community and educators connecting and becoming better together. That is why they created the Topic Discovery Library. It is an educator's one stop shop to **share** and **find** Topic templates! FOR FREE!!!

You can find the Topic Discovery Library by selecting the "Disco Library" tab at the top of your Educator Dashboard. Once there you can provide and receive inspiration for incorporating Flipgrid into your classroom.

How to Find & Add Topics

Search by selecting the dropdown menus or entering a search in the search bar.

Once you select a Topic to add you will have an opportunity to update and make any changes to the Topic before it is added to your grid.

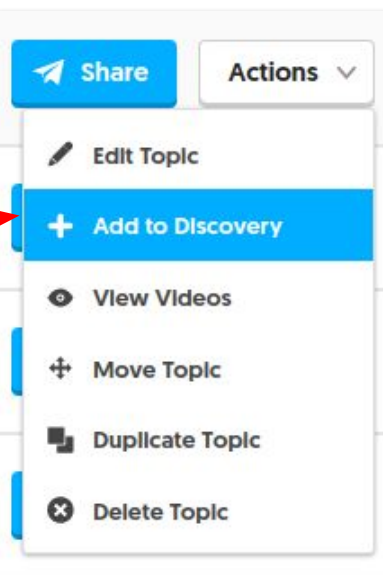


Discovery Library cont...

We wouldn't be able to find great Topics if it wasn't for other awesome educators sharing the Topics they've created and used. Just think, every Topic you share has the potential to ignite engagement opportunities in classes around the world! So share your Topics and be sure and complete your Flipgrid profile and link your social media accounts so that educators that value your shared Topics can connect with you and build their professional learning network.

How to Share Topics & Inspire

The best way to add Topics to the Discovery Library is from the My Grids tab in the Educator Dashboard. Select a Grid and find the Topic you want to share. Locate the Actions drop down and choose "Add to Discovery".



Topic Discovery Details

Define the audience, subject, and goal for the Topic and provide guidance on how to integrate it in a class.

Audience

Select an audience that best suits the themes/subject matter of this Topic.

Select a goal most aligned with the expected outcome of this Topic.

Integration Notes

Rich text editor toolbar with icons for undo, redo, bold, italic, underline, link, and unlink.

Next, you'll enter the Topic audience, subject, goal, and most importantly, integration notes. You will also have an opportunity to edit anything else in the Topic before it gets submitted to the Discovery Library.

IMPORTANT! When Sharing and Finding Topics:

- NO Responses or Replies from a Topic will be included when a Topic is added to the Topic Discovery Library.
- You may edit any of your Topic information before or after you share. Topics can be removed from the Discovery Library at anytime.
- Other Flipgrid educators will not see that you've added their Topic template and vice versa.

Flipgrid Explorer Series



Flipgrid welcomes scientists, engineers, creatives, and more to share their amazing work and challenge students on unique topics related to their field. The Series is designed to be broad so that you can adapt the material to your learner's age and to your unique curriculum.

Each month, the featured explorer(s) will create a series of launch-ready Disco Library Topics for you to use as you see fit. How your class engages in the material is totally up to you. Here is how it will work:

- Go to the Disco Library in your Flipgrid Educator Dashboard
- Search “Flipgrid Explorer Series” (Current topics will also be in the featured section)
- Add the explorer series topics from the Disco Library to any of your Grids
- Incorporate the topics into your curriculum, offer the experience as a bonus-lesson in a unique Grid, or take the Explorer's content and change the lesson around their video – again, totally up to you!

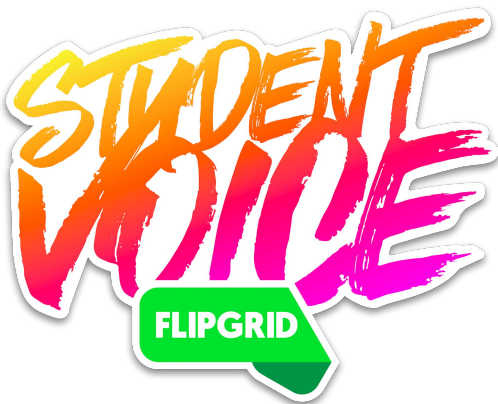
