Organizational Chart



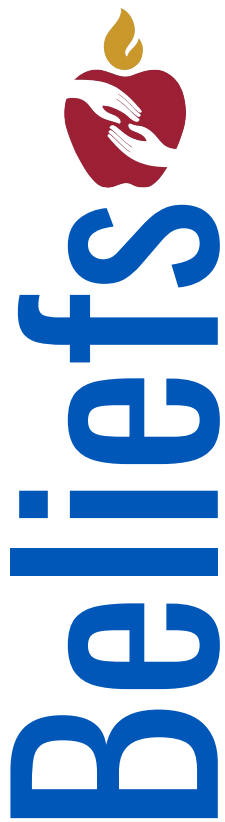

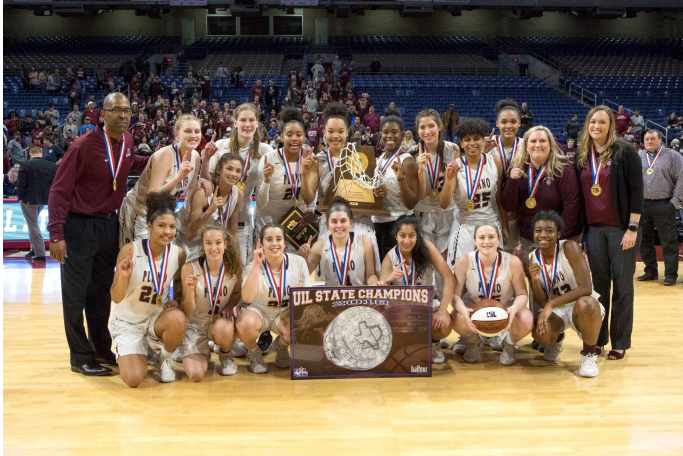

A variety of sports teams, fine arts offerings and curricular and noncurricular clubs allow students to find their fit in Plano ISD

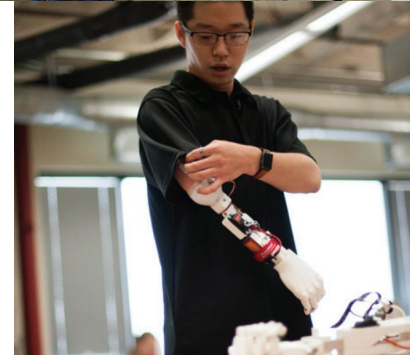


Life Ready Opportunities - Secondary Academies

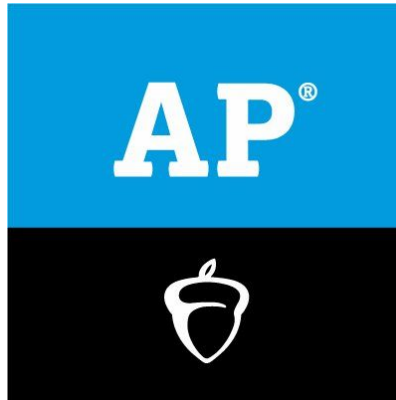

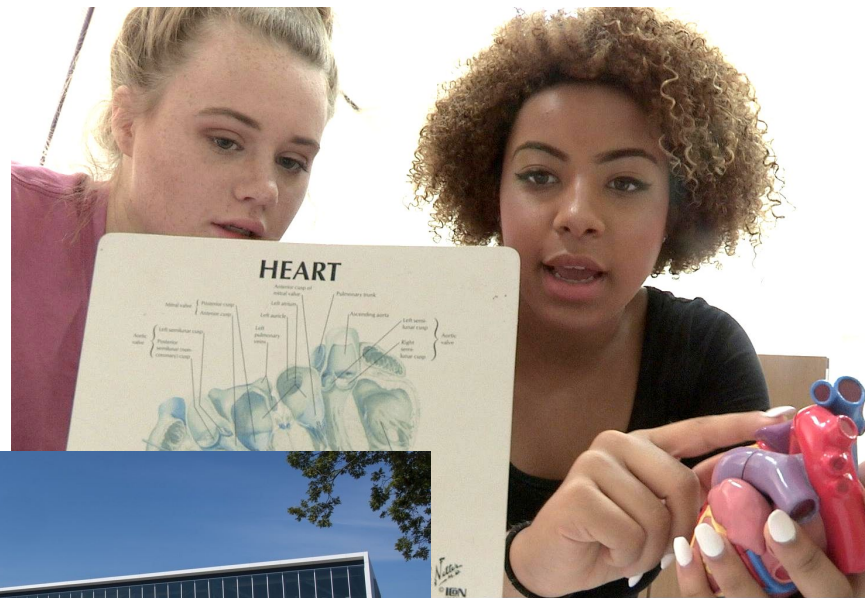

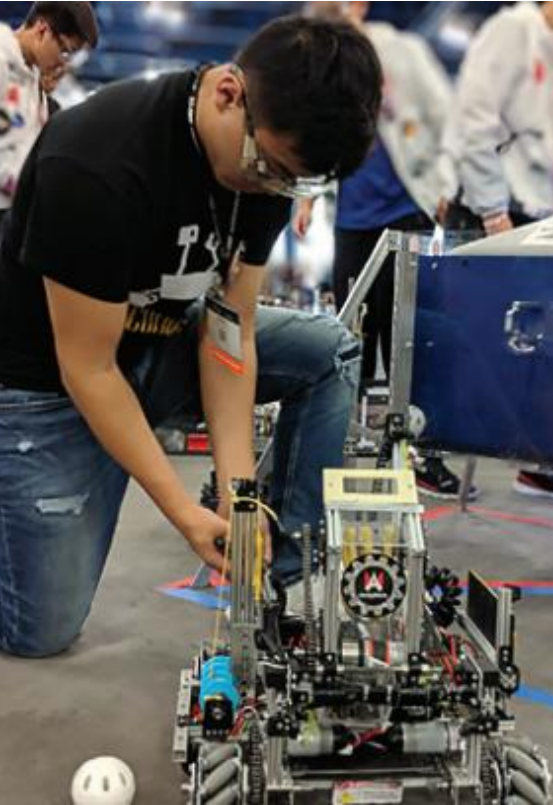
