John Freeman Hightower

John Freeman Hightower was born in Paris, Arkansas, on August 1, 1913, to Carl and Clara Parks Hightower. He attended public schools in Oklahoma, graduating from Moton High School in Taft, Oklahoma. Before entering high school, all eighth grade students had to take a prerequisite state exam. Mr. Hightower was recognized for having the highest score in the county of Muskogee.

Mr. Hightower attended college at Huston-Tillotson College in Austin, Texas. He graduated Cum Laude with degrees in biology and mathematics. He later earned his master's degree in administration from Texas Southern University. He has completed further study toward a doctorate at the University of North Texas and the University of California in Sacramento.

His career in education began in Anton, Texas, where he served as a biology teacher. He later moved to Plano where he began teaching science at Douglass High School, which was the segregated school. He later became principal of Douglass High School. Throughout his career he has touched the lives of students in many capacities including serving as a counselor in the Special Services Department, Director of Special Services, and Coordinator of Ethnic Relations prior to his retirement.

Mr. Hightower is currently involved in numerous community and civic affairs in the city of Plano. He continues to reach out and touch the lives of many people through his genuine efforts and commitment. He resides in the Plano area with his wife Myrtle Nash Hightower.
