



Plano Academic and Creative Education (PACE)



A program for students who require gifted services PACE is similar to Special Education in that it is an enrichment service designed to meet the needs of a different kind of learner.

PACE is not an Honors program.

Students requiring gifted services may...

- perform two grade levels above current grade
- learn exceptionally fast
- need only one to two repetitions for mastery
- thrive on complexity
- arrive at solutions in an unusual manner

If you have a child that you believe may need PACE services:

- 1. Notify your child's teacher or the campus gifted specialist.
- 2. Complete an online referral packet. Request a hard copy if needed.
- 3. Referral packets are due October 21.
- 4. Testing procedures will be communicated after the referral deadline.
- 5. If your student participated in a gifted program at their previous school, please contact the Gifted Specialist for next steps. This communication is due to the Specialist by August 22.
