


Time Bomb, by Joelle Charbonneau How this book stands out: Six kids are at school when a bomb goes off...and one of them is the bomber.


After Zero, by Christina Collins How this book stands out: A girl deals with selective mutism after things go terribly wrong at school and at home.

You might also like: Wintergirls, Speak, The Science of Breakable Things




The Night Diary, by Veera Hiranandani How this book stands out: Everything changes when India and Pakistan break up in 1947, and Nisha becomes a refugee.

You might also like: More Than We Can Tell, Just Listen, By Your Side




Restart, by Gordon Korman How this book stands out: Amnesia makes Chase take a hard look at the bully he once was...and wonder if he can change.


From Twinkle, With Love, by Sandhya Menon How this book stands out: Could Twinkle be in love with the wrong twin brother?


The First Rule of Punk, by Celia C. Perez How this book stands out: Funny story about learning to feel at home with yourself, complete with "zine" illustrations!


In the Shadow of the Sun, by Anne Sibley O'Brien How this book stands out: Gripping realistic survival fiction set in North Korea.
