



- Call the college admissions office for an appointment
- **Check web for Preview Days**
- Go when students are in session, if at all possible.
- **Bring a list of questions**
- **Get paper documentation**

POTENTIAL COLLEGE ATHLETES

- Athletes hoping to play sports at a D1 or D2 college must register with NCAA at <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>

- Be aware that there is an academic component to qualifying with NCAA
- Remember that the admissions office decides whether you get in, not the coaches!

Testing

College Admissions Tests – SAT/ACT

- Universities require either, many students take both
- Use school code
- Register online
- Register with your legal name as it is on your photo ID you will bring to the test (DL, passport, current year school ID)

Placement Exam – TSI (Texas Success Initiative)

- No impact on admissions
- Only for Texas public schools (both 2 and 4 year)
- Can be exempt with strong SAT or ACT scores
- Taken after applying to college and before orientation

Collin College offers over 600 scholarships each year. Dual credit high school seniors may apply for scholarships!

To be eligible a student must:

- Have a Collin issued ID#
- Have at least a 2.5 GPA
- Be taking 6-9 credit hours each semester (fall and spring)
- Complete the <u>online</u> application (3 short essays)

Workforce and Certificate Programs

- **Certificates** are a quick option to earn a credential that can make you more qualified for a job.

ex. CNA, digital marketing, construction management

- Associate of Applied Science Associate degree with specialized training in workforce subjects.
 ex. RN, Cybersecurity, Fire Science
- Some programs will not require SAT, ACT, or TSI scores.

College Take - Away

- Get started this weekend
- Ask your counselors & teachers for recommendation letters
- Start writing your essays ASAP (it's the hardest part)
- Let your parents know the costs
- Apply for scholarships

Application Terms to Know

Early Decision

- You commit to attend if you are accepted
- You must cancel all other applications if accepted
- Ivy league/privat e

Early Action

- Indicate your first choice college & receive notice early
- You are not committed to enroll
- Shows your interest in the school


Priority Deadline

- Increase odds of being admitted & receiving scholarships
- Encourages students to apply early
- Not binding
- Nov 1st for most public schools

Regular Decision

- Deadlines usually Jan 1-March 15
- May apply to other colleges
- Runs into FAFSA priority deadline

COUNSELORS LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

- Completed during senior year
- Visit your Counselor's Google Classroom to learn about the recommendation process.
- Not all colleges require a counselor letter of recommendation.
- Complete as much info as possible AND continually communicate with counselor – regular emails are great!

 Allow a minimum of 10 school days for letter to be submitted



TEACHER LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

- Not required by all schools
- Speak personally with the teacher!
- Request letter through SchooLinks after teacher agrees, also teachers will submit letters and secondary report through SchooLinks to be sent directly to your colleges.
- Some schools require more or less than others, so pay attention to your colleges' requirements
- Always follow up with a Thank You
- Allow a minimum of 10 school days for letter to be submitted

You aren't at school just to learn facts. Start exploring what life after school might be like by exploring industries and careers.






