

CTE Path: Public Services Endorsement Course Choices

Within the requirement of the 26 credits to earn an endorsement, a student must complete the following.

- (A) A coherent sequence of four or more credits in CTE that includes:
 - at least two courses in the same CTE career cluster from BOX 1; and
 - at least one advanced CTE course from BOX 1; (designated with "A"); and
 - the final course in the sequence must be obtained from one of the CTE career clusters listed in **BOX 2** Note: Select a sequence of CTE courses that total <u>4 (or more) credits</u> and meet the criteria above. The total number of courses is not a factor for the CTE path.

Or;

(B) four courses in Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC).
