In the fall of 1981, Plano East Senior High School was opened with 563 juniors. At present, the approximate enrollment at Plano East is 3100 juniors and seniors. An additional 415 9th and 10th graders are enrolled in the IB World School. INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE WORLD SCHOOL

The International Baccalaureate Program is a rigorous course of study designed to meet the needs of highly motivated students. Certified as an IB school in July 1995, the Plano East IB program includes a total of approximately 695 students in the 11th and 12th grade IB program and 9th and 10th grade Pre-IB prep program. All students admitted to the Plano East IB World School are full diploma candidates.
