PLANO ISD BOND VATRE 2022



A Voter Approval Tax Rate Election (VATRE) is an election required by the state that asks voters to consider approving a modified tax rate to increase revenue for student programs as well as teacher and staff salaries. A VATRE will generate local revenue for Plano ISD to:

 Provide the district's teachers and staff with additional compensation, allowing Plano ISD to retain a competitive and high-quality workforce for our students and community

Allow Plano ISD to continue offering quality

programs for our students

- Maintain positions and systems for the safety, security and wellbeing of students
- Help reduce the budget deficit
- Help offset the loss of federal funding
- Maximize Plano ISD's M&O funding

PISD's Maintenance & Operations tax rate, which funds teacher salaries and the day-to-day operations of the district, has been compressed as a result of House Bill 3. As the M&O tax rate has dropped 14.7 cents in four years, Plano ISD is not able to generate as much revenue per student.

If the VATRE is approved by voters, the net revenue generated by Plano ISD would be approximately \$9 million annually.

OVER 65 TAX CEILING

Plano ISD property taxes for citizens age 65 or older would not be affected by Plano ISD elections as long as a homestead and over 65 exemption application have been filed with the Collin Central Appraisal District.



TAX RATE HISTORY


Plano ISD's overall tax rate has dropped 17.9 cents in five years. If voters approve all November propositions, the district's total tax rate will be 6.1 cents lower than last year.



Plano ISD trustees approved a new tax rate in September, which is lower than last year's rate. This chart shows Plano ISD's position as compared to other Collin County school districts' rates (or proposed rates) for this year.
