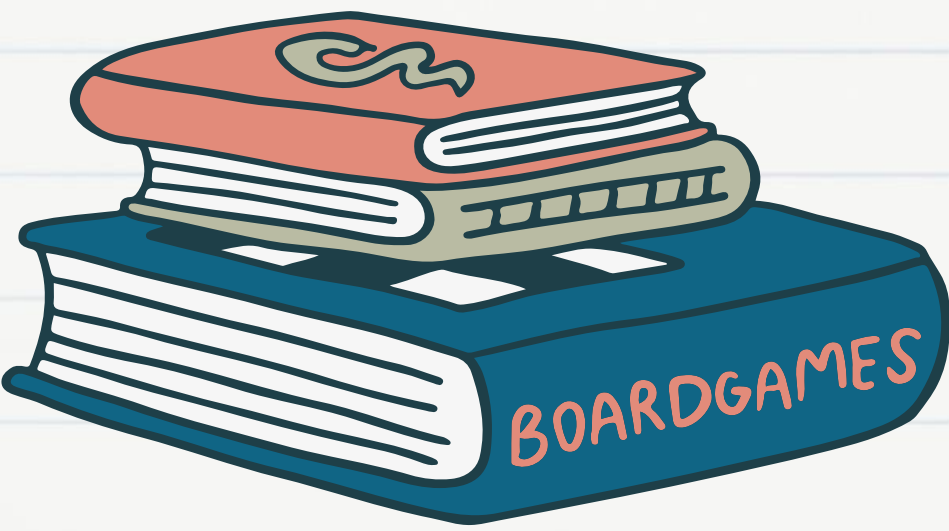

Students must commit to 2 consecutive years once the Level 1 language has started.

Languages are OPTIONAL in middle school but must be started in 9th grade.

Athletics is a FULL YEAR Commitment

Athletics

Students who sign up for athletics 1st semester will play football.

Students planning to try out for volleyball or basketball will register for a year of PE. If they make the team they will be moved into athletics.

Students must maintain a 70 or above in all subjects to be eligible to participate.
NO PASS, NO PLAY

Physical Exam & Track Team

A physical exam is required by UIL before a student is allowed to participate in athletics (tryout or practice). A physical exam is required EVERY year.

Any 7th or 8th grade student is welcome to join the Hendrick Track Team.

The Hendrick Track Team will practice after school, NOT during the athletic period.

Rank One

Parents must complete Rank One forms prior to student tryout or participation

ANY changes into or out of athletics will be made on an individual basis and will impact the electives, class times and teachers you have. It will disrupt your schedule, and you may not have control over elective changes.



BEYOND YEAR ONE

- Students have the opportunity to be placed into a full band based on playing ability, musical aptitude, and discipline
- Performance requirements go to 6–8 performances per year, including individual performances
- Weekly rehearsals (sectionals – once a week) occur mornings before school





REQUIREMENTS

- Band placement auditions will take place Spring 2024.
- Students participate in 3-4 evening performances
- Commit to putting in time and effort outside of class through regular home practice

Intermediate Choir

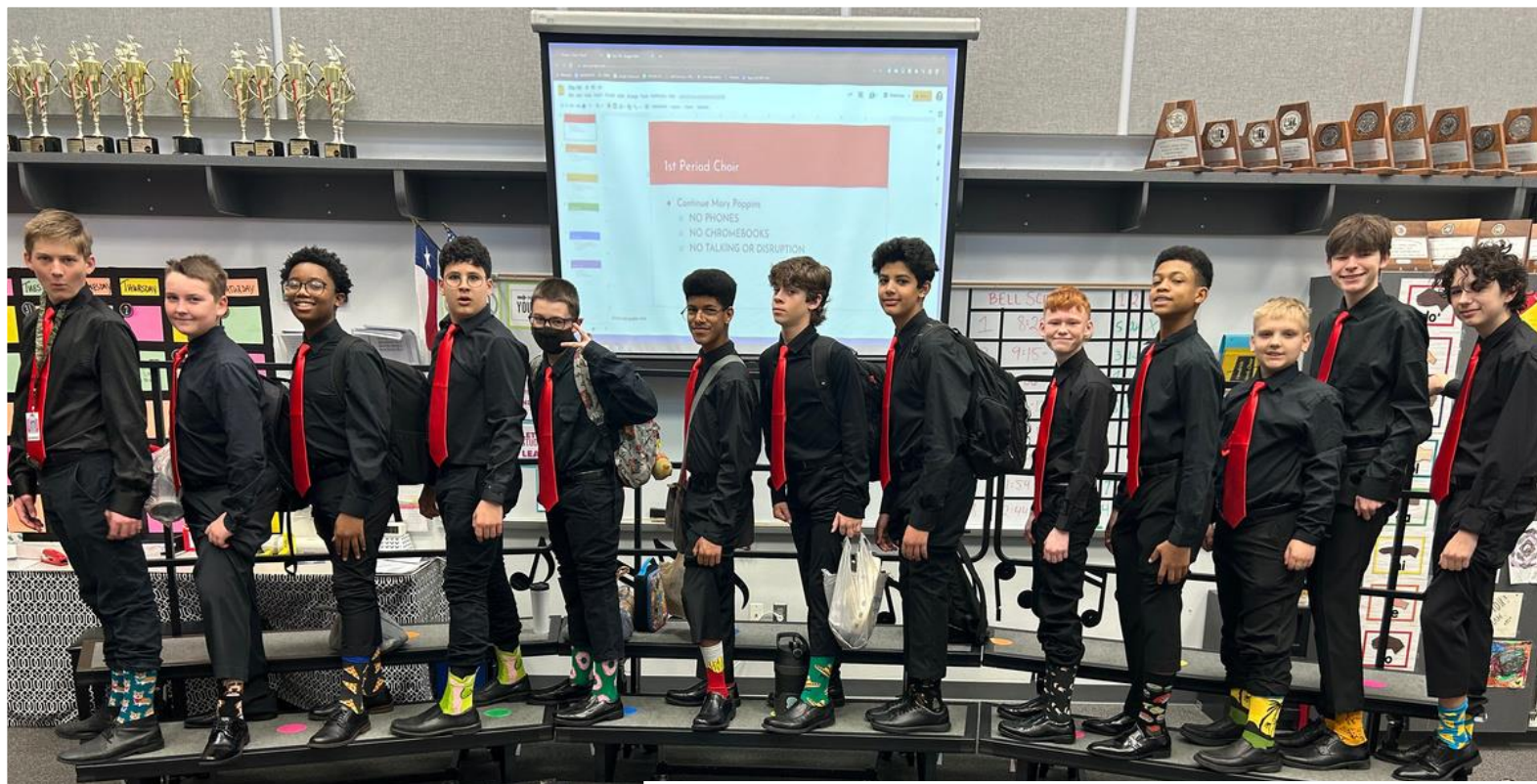
Seventh or Eighth grade only

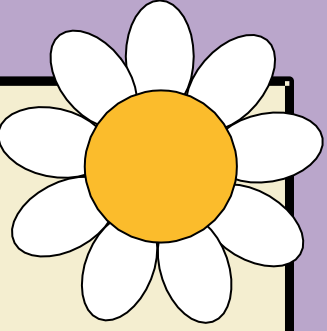
In this class, we build upon the skills you learned in art one. Things are a bit more challenging, and the projects we do are bigger.

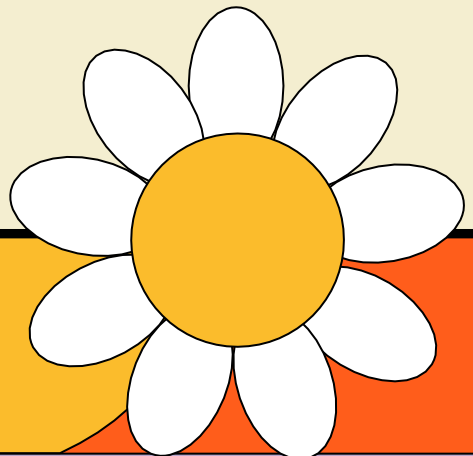
The most advanced art class. If you have taken Art 1 **and** Art 2 and you put a good amount of effort and skill into everything we work on, you will be able to take this class.

Why AVID?



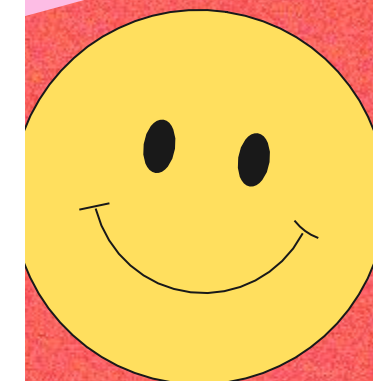
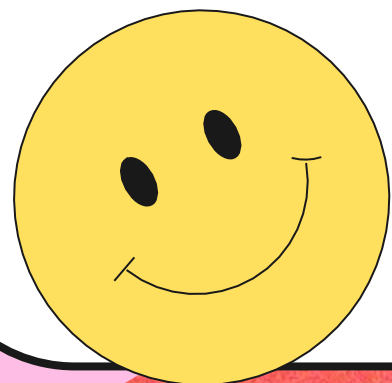
AVID

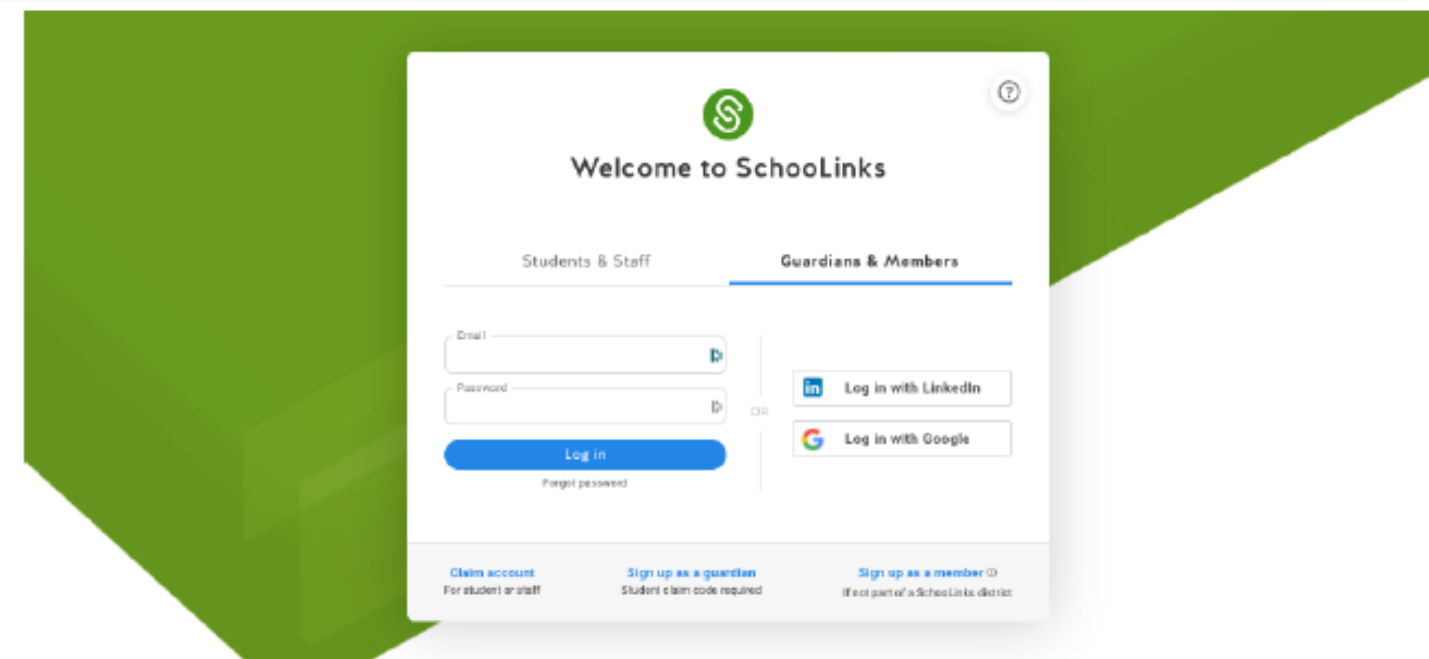

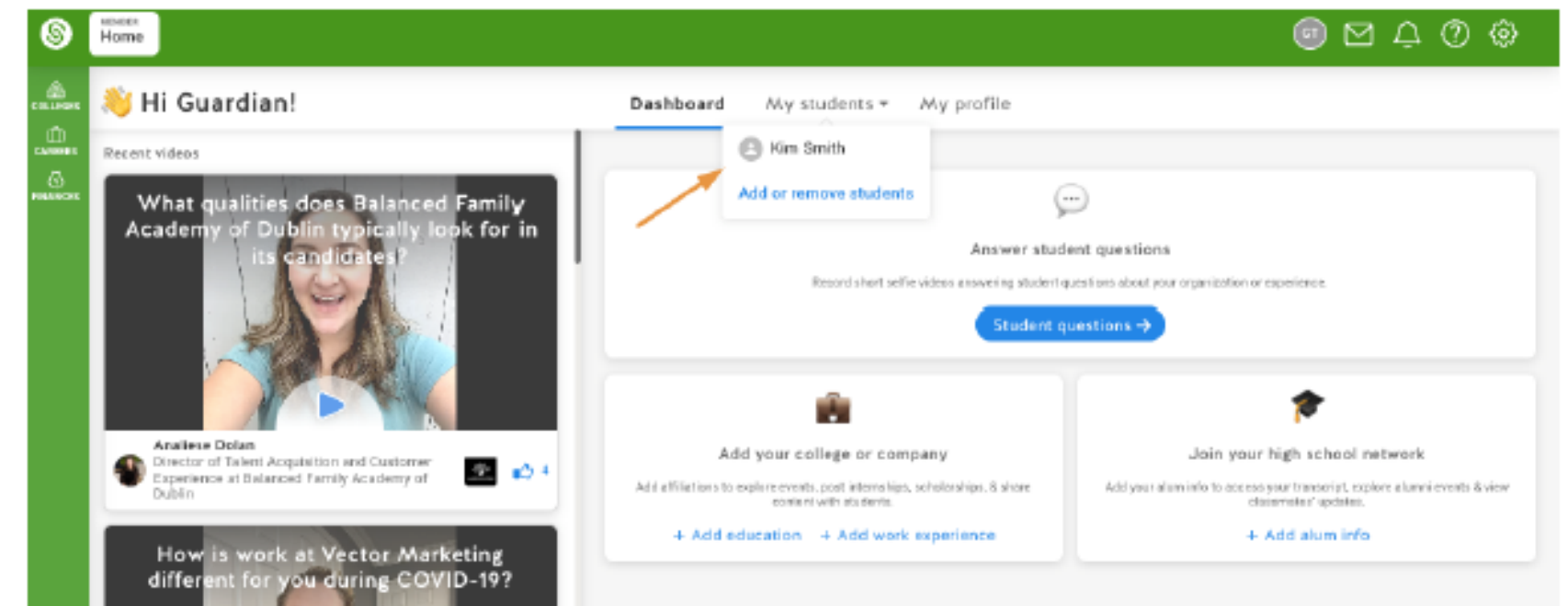
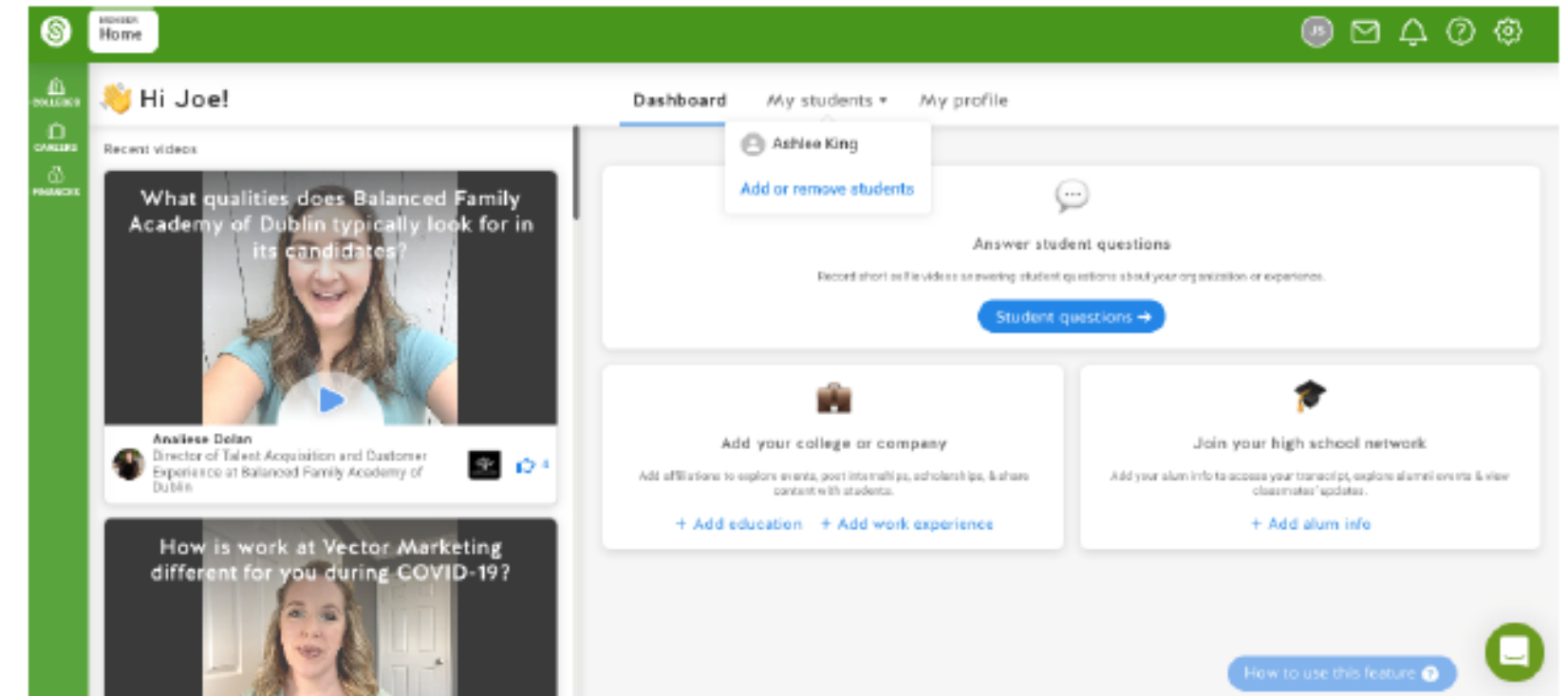
