Employment of law enforcement jobs is expected to grow by seven percent from 2010—2012. There is a continual demand for public safety which will lead to new openings for officers in the local departments.

Police	\$55,010 per year or \$26.45 per hour
EMT	\$30,360 per year or \$14.60 per hour
Firefighter	\$45,250 per year or \$21.76 per hour
