



# What is Dual Credit?

Simultaneously earn high school <u>and</u> college credit in <u>one</u> class!





### Benefits of Being a Collin College Dual Credit Student

- Courses count toward high school credit
- Small class sizes
- Educational support from Collin College instructors
- Begin a college transcript
- Experience the college environment and rigor of college courses



### How Much You Will Save!

**University of Texas at Dallas** 

\$2,637 for a 3 credit hour course\*

**University of North Texas** 

\$1,499 for a 3 credit hour course\*

is \$164

## Dual Credit Courses are Transferable to Most <u>Public</u> Four-Year Colleges and Universities in Texas.

#### **FERPA**

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act



- Similar to HIPAA law
- Federal law that ensures privacy of student educational records

(begins when student starts college regardless of age)

- Collin College cannot share grades, course schedules, test scores, etc. with parents
- A great opportunity for students to learn the college process and take on new responsibilities





### **Dual Credit Eligibility**

- Students complete the <u>entire</u> Collin College admissions process
- Available with permission from your high school each semester for every course
- Must meet college readiness standards as defined by Texas Success Initiative (TSI)
- Students must meet both high school and Collin College academic requirements to continue in the dual credit program

### **Dual Credit Enrollment Process**

- Meet with your high school counselor, if you have questions
- 2) APPLY for admission (apply.collin.edu)
- 3) Remove all holds
- 4) Register for your classes
- 5) Pay for your classes

### High School Approval

 Your high school must approve ALL classes, including nondual credit classes (concurrent).

• You must have <u>written</u> approval from your high school to make changes to dual credit classes.




### **Application Tips**

- Create an account (please do <u>NOT</u> use your ISD email)
- List your SSN
- Under "Intended Academic Goal", select "YES" for Dual Credit
- Select any Major\*\*
- Residency/tuition is decided based on your answers on the application and the documentation you provide, if requested
- Student will receive his/her Collin ID number (CWID), email address, CougarWeb username and password in 3-5 business days





### What is CougarWeb?



Students will receive a CougarWeb login 3-5 business days **AFTER** applications are submitted.

CougarWeb is an online portal that includes all of the information and access to services that students need while attending Collin College.



### Texas Success Initiative (TSI)



- The TSI is designed to measure college readiness in reading, writing, and mathematics.
- It is used for course placement purposes.
- Students must be at college level in reading and writing for the majority of courses.



### TSI Waivers

### TSI: What Will I Need to Do?

- Complete **Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA) ONLINE** and print the certificate of completion.
- Review the email you will receive at your Cougar Web Email address from assessments@Collin.edu regarding testing procedures.
- Pay at the cashier's office or online. The cost is \$29.
- Walk-in to test at any campus Testing Center during testing hours. Bring your receipt, your photo ID, and PAA certificate of completion. You will not need to bring a calculator.
- See an Academic Advisor after completing the TSI to review your results.



### Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination

Dual Credit students taking classes at any Collin campus
MUST provide proof of vaccination within 5 years or
documentation of an exemption if they are under the age
of 22. The vaccination must be administered at least 10 days
prior to start of the student's entering term.

Dual Credit students taking classes at their high school campus are eligible for an exemption by completing and signing the HS permission form.




### Mandatory Campus Safety Training

- Complete quiz with a 100% score and be sure to click submit at the end







### Registration Instructions

For Dual Credit Classes at High School/College Campus

- Log into CougarWeb
- Go to Registration and Planning
- Click on Add, Drop, or Withdraw
- Enter Credit Fall 2020 term
- Click on Enter CRNs tab
- Enter the specific CRN for your designated course
- Click Add to Summary
- Click Submit

## Tuition (Effective Fall 2019)

\$54 per credit hour for students residing in Collin County
= \$164 for a 3 credit hour course

\$100 per credit hour for students residing out-of-county = \$302 for a 3 credit hour course

Total cost per 3 credit hour course includes a \$2 per semester student records fee.


\*All fees are subject to change upon approval of the Collin Board of Trustees\*

Tuition is paid per semester. Free & Reduced Lunch students may be eligible for a tuition waiver.







Prepare them for what to expect

College gives students a tremendous amount of freedom.

No one is monitoring their progress on a daily basis. No one knows whether they're doing the assignments. Students should be prepared to do most of their learning on their own.

Self-motivation and discipline are important. A general guideline is that for every one hour spent in class, college students should spend two hours out of class reading, studying and completing assignments.
