#### **IB Exam Fees**

9<sup>th</sup> Grade no exam

10<sup>th</sup> Grade no exam

11<sup>th</sup> Grade \$172 registration +

\$119/exam

12<sup>th</sup> Grade \$119/exam

TOTAL \$892 (registration + 6 exams)

Parents are responsible for all exam and registration costs. Free and reduced lunch students pay at a greatly reduced rate.

### **Selection Process**

- ☐ Students must reside within PISD attendance boundaries
- ☐ 200 incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade students
- ☐ Lottery with representation from every middle school
- ☐ Students who are not initially chosen are placed on a wait list.
- ☐ Students may enter the IB World School in grade 9,10, or 11.

November 16, 2018- December 14, 2018

Application opens on www.pisd.edu/ib and district website

Placement notification is through email on January 11, 2019

Commitment deadline is January 18, 2019.
