



Notice of Intent to Provide Human Sexuality Instruction

Dear Parent or Guardian of a High School Student:

Your child is enrolled in a Plano Independent School District (PISD) High School Health I, Principles of Health Science class, or the Health Science Academy Course HLT SCI I, the curriculum for these classes includes a unit on human sexuality. Both the Plano ISD Board of Trustees and the Plano ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) endorse this Texas standards-based curriculum. The SHAC, comprised of parents, community, students, and staff members- is appointed by the Plano Independent School District Board of Trustees and assists in ensuring that local community values are reflected in the District's health education instruction.

Section 28.004 of the Texas Education Code requires that sexuality instruction in Texas schools "present abstinence as the preferred choice of behavior for unmarried and/or school age children" and "devote more attention to abstinence from sexual behavior than to any other behavior." The State of Texas adopted the textbook being used in this course. A summary of the sexuality content of the sexuality unit includes:

Reproduction, Pregnancy, and Development

- Identify the structure and function of the male and female reproductive systems
- Fetal development from conception, through pregnancy and birth
- Importance of prenatal care and proper nutrition
- Harmful effects of alcohol, tobacco, and other substances
- Effects of health behaviors on body systems
- Significance of body changes during adolescence
- Summarize the process of heredity, and explain genetic disorders

Building Responsible Relationships

- Refusal skills and avoidance of unsafe situations
- Benefits of abstinence for emotional health, pregnancy, and sexually transmitted disease prevention

- Analyze behavior in a dating relationship that will enhance the dignity, respect, and responsibility relating to marriage
- Recognize sexual harassment and realize that it is wrong and harms people
- Explain how high self-esteem can help you make a decision based on what's right for you

Prevention Strategies

- Strategies related to the prevention of communicable and non-communicable diseases
- Benefits of abstinence for emotional health, pregnancy, and STD prevention
- Effectiveness and ineffectiveness of barrier protection and other contraceptive methods including the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases (STD's), keeping in mind the effectiveness of remaining abstinent until marriage
- Describe the advantages of sexual abstinence, and respect abstinence as a positive choice

Risks of Adolescent Sexual Activity

- Explain how reasonable and unreasonable risks affect your personal behavior
- Examine the effects of health behaviors on body systems
- Importance of early detection and heeding warning signs to seek health care
- Define the term: “sexually transmitted diseases” and “Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome”
- Benefits of abstinence for emotional health, pregnancy and STD prevention, emphasizing that abstinence is the only 100% effective way to prevent pregnancy and STD’s
- Analyze the dynamics of family roles and responsibilities relating to health behavior
- Identify and describe the prevention, transmission, symptoms, and treatment for the common STDs and HIV/AIDS
- Report the latest statistics on HIV/AIDS and STDs
- Examine pictures of people infected with various STDs
- Explore the consequences of early sexual activity
- Differentiate between fact and fiction about HIV/AIDS and STDs

Instruction for the sexuality unit of our health course will be provided by Plano Independent School District certified health teachers. These teachers have been provided specific training to ensure that the personal matter of human sexuality be addressed in a professional and sensitive manner. A guest speaker may be used to discuss HIV/AIDS, but no sexuality content will be discussed during presentation and only pre-approved Board of Trustees content will be discussed.

If you wish to review the materials used in this course in advance of this instruction, we encourage you to do so; please contact the school principal or health teacher to make such arrangements.

By state law, if you do not want your child to receive the instruction in this unit, you may request that your child be excused from health classes during that time. If you select this option, please send the completed form entitled “Request to Withhold Child from Sexuality Instruction” to your child’s health teacher as soon as possible. Your child’s health teacher will assign alternative lessons or activities and arrange a place for your child to complete the work outside of the room in which human sexuality instruction occurs.

Your child will not be subject to any disciplinary action, academic penalty or any other sanction as a result of this action. If we do not receive a signed copy of the form, your child will be expected to participate in this unit of the health curriculum.

Parents and guardians also have the opportunity to be involved in the development of the curriculum used in human sexuality instruction. The PISD School Health Advisory Council is appointed by the Board of Trustees and assists in ensuring that local community values are reflected in the District’s Health Education instruction.
