Updated Plan



- We worked with our campus principals and two focus groups, one with students and one with parents, representing the four graduating classes as a new graduation plan was created to reflect current safety practices
- We shared the following plan, which features graduations over two days as follows:



- All ceremonies to be held at Clark Stadium
- Dates & Times:
 - Academy HS: Friday, June 4 at 8:30 a.m.
 - Plano Senior: Friday, June 4 at 7:30 p.m.
 - Plano West: Saturday, June 5 at 8:30 a.m.
 - Plano East: Saturday, June 5 at 7:30 p.m.
- Guest tickets per student: 4


Rain Dates: June 6 & 7

Plan Considerations

Venue Capacity & Tickets:

- Using a district facility offers some flexibility on capacity and general event operations - The Star is currently operating at a 30% capacity per NFL
- Clark Stadium's capacity allows guests to be seated in pods of four in the stands while still being distanced
- All ceremonies will be live streamed and recorded as options for those who can't attend or don't feel comfortable attending





Plan Considerations

Safety:

- Outdoor venues currently offer a safer option for large group gatherings
- Graduate chairs, participants on stage and guests will be socially distanced
- Students, guests and staff will be required to wear masks
- Plano ISD stadium bag policy will be implemented for the ceremonies
- Gates open 90 minutes prior to the start of the senior high school ceremonies to reduce the size of crowds waiting to enter (60 minutes for Academy HS)









Plan Considerations

- Possible weather issues (e.g., heat, rain, lightning, etc.):
 - To account for these concerns, all ceremonies are being held during times of the day that are typically cooler and rain dates will be communicated up front to families along with the planned ceremony dates and times (June 6 & 7)

On average, there is a 37% chance of rain in Plano throughout the day on June 5.



Vetting the New Plan

- The student and parent focus groups included written survey feedback along with verbal discussions
- This plan was shared for feedback with campus administrators





89%

of participants said **YES** when asked if they were satisfied with the experience the new plan should provide them and their families? The remaining 11% answered maybe.

83%

of participants said **YES** when asked if rain days are needed, would they have the ability to attend the makeup ceremony? The remaining 17% answered maybe.

Student Survey Response Highlights:

Question: What are your initial thoughts on this plan?

- I think it sounds good as long as it's socially distanced and safe!
- I love it! I think it upholds the covid guidelines well and still lets family and students hold onto the best parts of a traditional graduation.
- I think that the current plan is good. I'm glad that we will have a somewhat "normal" graduation.
- Before coming to the meeting, this is what I pictured as the most ideal plan for graduation.

Question: What do you think are the pros of this plan?

- Outdoors but in-person, safe yet still a "legitimate" graduation experience
- 4 guest tickets (good number for family), livestream/recorded video (good for extended family so they don't have to fly in)
- It'll be outside! And that's good. And theoretically, we'll all be distanced and wearing masks, and that's good too.
- We are able to have a real graduation



Question: What do you think are the cons of this plan?

- I think 4 tickets is a little low, but if that is what you have to do to keep the crowd socially distant, then I understand.
- Weather. Other than rain, i'm also concerned with the summer heat.
- Making sure people stay within their pods during the course of the graduation.
- Enforcement's going to be really hard as it is. How will we enforce wearing masks and keeping a distance?

Question: Please tell us what elements of a traditional ceremony are most important to you?

- Walking up to get my diploma, taking photos (no mask preferably), seeing my peers, speeches from students
- Bringing family, speeches, graduating with whole class
- Cap toss
- Pictures for my family
- Just watching a kid get a piece of paper is the most important thing. Everyone deserves to have that moment, I think.

Parent Survey Response Highlights:

Question: What are your initial thoughts on this plan?

- I like this plan a lot. I think it gives families the opportunity to be in-person and to have the most at risk to be able to live stream the event. All can participate.
- Sounds good to me. I like the outdoor option.
- I like it. The weather worries me. The heat more than the rain. I hope that kids are allowed to wear shorts under their graduation gowns.

Question: What do you think are the pros of this plan?

- Allows for both in-person and virtual options
- Safety and as close to normal as we can get at this time
- Being outdoors is the right way to go at this point
- Allows all students to graduate together to celebrate each other.
- Students and families get to celebrate this achievement.

Parent Survey Response Highlights:

Question: What do you think are the cons of this plan?

- Social distancing the guests while going to seats
- Restrictions on number of guests for larger families
- Heat! And weather in general.
- The stadium won't be as comfortable for some (especially older guests)
- Honestly, I'm so happy we get a ceremony that right now I cannot see the cons.

Question: Please tell us what elements of a traditional ceremony are most important to you?

- Students walking across stage, name being called, photos, video
- Pictures from professional photographer
- Large video screen so we can see;
 streaming so that people can see at home
- Speeches from the students. Well wishes from administration.
- Preferably pictures without a mask
- Photos!

Alternate Schedule

- After presenting these initial ideas, we received additional feedback expressing concerns about hosting an event during the daytime on a weekday, as well as concerns related to daytime temperatures
- A possible alternate schedule to help mitigate those concerns would be hosting the event over three days as follows:
 - Plano Senior: Thursday, June 3 at 7:30 p.m.
 - Plano West: Friday, June 4 at 7:30 p.m.
 - Academy HS: Saturday, June 5 at 8:30 a.m.
 - Plano East: Saturday, June 5 at 7:30 p.m.

Next Steps



- Finalize the ceremony dates and times
- Share the final plan with campus administrators
- Communicate the updated plan to seniors and their families
- Finalize needed guidelines for ceremony programming
 - Areas to consider include:
 - Processional/recessional
 - Photos (mask protocol)
 - Student lineup at the stage
 - Presentation of diploma covers
