



Bill Statistics Report April 19, 2023

Here are some statistics on bills introduced and moving this session. These are accurate through April 18, 2023:

SENATE:

Number of SB's and SJR's filed:	2,701
Number of SB's and SJR's not yet heard in Senate Committees:	1,770 (65.5%)
Number of SB's and SJR's heard in Senate Committees:	931 (34.5%)
Number of SB's and SJR's reported out of Senate Committees:	235 (8.7%)
Number of SB's/SJR's "voted" out but not yet "reported":	77
Number of SB's waiting for Local & Uncontested:	40
Number of SB's and SJR's passed by the Senate this session:	361 (13.3%)
Number of HB's passed by the Senate this session:	1 ` ´

HOUSE:

Number of HB's and HJR's filed:	5,588
Number of HB's and HJR's not yet heard in House Committees:	3,270 (58.5%)
Number of HB's and HJR's heard in House Committees:	2,318 (41.5%)
Number of HB's/HJR's reported out of House Committees:	587 (10.5%)
Number of HB's/HJR's "voted" out but not yet "reported":	487
Number of HB's and HJR's in House Calendars Committee:	385
Number of HB's and HJR's in Local & Consent Committee:	78
Number of HB's and HJR's passed by the House this session:	186 (3.3%)
Number of SB's and SJR's passed by the House this session:	2

Here are some historical stats on bills filed vs. bills passed:

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2021 - 1,071 of 6,927 - 15.46%

2019 - 1,438 of 7,541 - 19.0%

2017 - 1,216 of 6,800 - 17.88%

2015 - 1,330 of 6,476 - 20.54%

2013 - 1,444 or 6,061 - 23.82%

2011 - 1,390 of 6,003 - 23.16%

2009 - 1,466 of 7,609 - 19.27%

2007 - 1,498 of 6,362 - 23.55%

2005 - 1,398 of 5,629 - 24.84%
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Observations:

 Prior to this session, the high-water mark for number of bills introduced was 2009 – 7,609, although 2019 had almost that many - *Until this year*,

when a record-breaking 7,865 were filed at the deadline – now there are 8,289 HB's, HJR's, SB's, and SJR's

- The high-water mark for percentage of bills passed was 2005 almost 25%
- The number and percentage of bills that passed in 2021 was way down below 16%

Statistics from the 2021 Legislative Session:

- Most of the bills in 2021 died in committee without even getting a hearing.
- 46% of House Bills in 2021 DIED in House Committees WITHOUT getting a hearing.
- A whopping 59% of Senate bills DIED in Senate Committees WITHOUT getting a hearing.
- If the bills got a hearing in committee, they had a good chance of moving out of committee.
- 76% of House Bills that GOT a hearing, were Voted out of Committee.
- Only 24% of HB's that GOT a hearing still died in committee.
- Of those 1905 HBs that came out of House committees, only 647 ended up passing the House (34%) because the others died in the House Calendars Committee.
- Almost 80% of Senate Bills that got a hearing were voted out of Committee
- Only 20% of the SB's that GOT a hearing still died in committee.
- Almost all of the SB's that came out of Senate Committees passed the Senate, (but I don't have that exact stat)
- The House was pretty good to Senate bills 74% of them ended up passing the House. Some died in House Committees, the House Calendars Committee and even ran out of time on the Calendar.
- The Senate was even nicer to House bills 93% of the HB's that passed the House, also passed the Senate. A few died on the calendars, but in 2021, almost all of the HB's passed by the House were voted out of Senate Committees.
- The bottom line is Clearing the House of Origin is the hardest part. If a bill passes one chamber, three-fourths of them will pass the House and almost all of them will pass the Senate.
