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## PLANO ISD ANNOUNCES FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE MEAL GUIDELINES

**Plano, TX** — **August 9, 2022.** During the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress authorized spending that allowed schools to serve free meals for all students. Those funds are not authorized to continue for the 2022-2023 school year. As a result, Plano Independent School District must return to charging for school meals and offering free and reduced-price meals based on student eligibility. Families are encouraged to complete the Application for Free and Reduced-Price School Meals available: online at <a href="https://www.schoolcafe.com/pisd">www.schoolcafe.com/pisd</a>, your local campus, or 6600 Alma Drive, Suite B, Plano Texas 75023.

The application will determine a child's eligibility for free and reduced-price meals and may assist in the determination of eligibility for other state or federal benefits. Only one application needs to be completed per household. Plano Independent School District will notify the household of the child's eligibility. The Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) administers school nutrition programs in Texas and offers an eligibility calculator at <a href="https://www.SquareMeals.org/ProgramEligibility">www.SquareMeals.org/ProgramEligibility</a>.

### Criteria for Free and Reduced-Price Meal Benefits

The following criteria will be used to determine a child's eligibility for free or reduced-price meal benefits:

### Income

Household income that is at or below the income eligibility levels

## **Categorical Eligibility**

Household receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF); or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)

#### **Program Participant**

Child's status as a foster child, homeless, runaway, migrant, or displaced by a declared disaster Child's enrollment in Head Start or Even Start

## **Income Eligibility**

For those households that qualify for free or reduced-price meals based on income, an adult in the household must fill out the free and reduced-price meal application and return it to the front office of

your student's campus. Those individuals filling out the application will need to provide the following information:

Names of all household members

- Amount, frequency and source of current income for each household member
- Last 4 digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the
  application or, if the adult does not have a social security number, check the box for "No Social
  Security number"
- Signature of an adult household member attesting that the information provided is correct

## **Categorical or Program Eligibility**

Plano ISD is working with local agencies to identify children who are categorically and program-eligible. Plano ISD will notify the households of these children that they do not need to complete an application. Any household that does not receive a letter, but feels they should have, can complete an application.

Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for determining eligibility. The school officials may also verify applications at any time during the school year.

# **Determining Eligibility**

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal guidelines, the Food and Nutritional Services office will review applications and determine eligibility. Households or guardians dissatisfied with the Reviewing Official's eligibility determination may wish to discuss the decision with the Reviewing Official on an informal basis. Households wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to Mr. Johnny Hill, Deputy Superintendent for Business and Employee Services, 2700 W. 15<sup>th</sup> Street, Plano TX 75075.

## **Unexpected Circumstance**

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should submit another application. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the attached current income eligibility guidelines.

### **Non-Discrimination Statement**
