

The Highly Engaged Classroom



- Promote positive feelings (How do I feel?)
- Promote attention and interest (Am I interested?)
- Promote connectedness and relevancy (Is this important?)
- Promote self-efficacy (Can I do this?)

The Hot Seat

- Promote self-efficacy
- Can I do this?

- Prepares students to respond under pressure
- Builds teamwork in the classroom
- Creates dynamic tension in a safe environment

The Hot Seat

- Promote self-efficacy
- Can I do this?

- One student chosen to sit in hot seat at front of room
- A question is asked and only that student may answer
- Student can answer or ask a classmate to whisper the answer in his ear
- Process continues until the correct answer is given
- When correct answer is given, student chooses next student to sit in the hot seat

Target in the middle

- Promote self-efficacy
- Can I do this?

- Human graphing
- Facilitates interaction among students
- Great way to collect informal data
- Assesses perceived mastery


Target in the middle

- Promote self-efficacy
- Can I do this?

- Students form a circle
- Teacher announces concept, vocabulary word, or process
- Students move inward toward the middle based on their confidence regarding the topic
- Students share one thing they know (outside -> in or inside -> out)
- Finish with a writing prompt
