



A checklist will help you get the most out of College Night.

### **Before you go to College Night**

- Find out which colleges will be at College Night (a list is available in eNews) and write down the names of the ones you want to learn about.
- Make a list of any questions you have.
- Bring your list, a pen, paper and a bag to hold college brochures.
- Make sure the email address that you give out won't embarrass you — remember, college admission officers will see it.

### **While you're at College Night**

- Know the table location of the schools on your list and plan a route. Tables are set up in the cafeteria and two gyms. Some schools are making presentations in the library and in classrooms.
- Visit tables and ask college representatives questions. For example, you can ask, "What kind of student are you looking for?" or "What makes your campus special?"
- Take a minute to jot down any information you think is important before moving on to the next table.
- Check out some of the other tables when you're done with the colleges on your list. You may stumble onto a great college you hadn't considered.

### **When You Get Home**

- Ask yourself which colleges stood out and why.
- Organize the college material you collected and review it that week while it's fresh in your mind.
- Go over any notes you took during the fair.
- Throw out the pamphlets of colleges you've ruled out so you can focus on the colleges you're interested in.
- Do more research on the colleges you're considering. Explore websites, contact the admission office or plan a campus visit. If you liked what you saw at College Night, it may be time to see the college in person.
